Seaside golf third after one round at regionals

BANKS — The Seaside boys golf team is sitting in third place after one round of the District 1 regional golf tournament, which concludes Tuesday at Quail Valley Golf Course.

Valley Catholic leads with a 310 team score, and Scappoose is second at 332. The Gulls carded a 347 in the opening round to give the Cowapa League teams the top three spots after Day 1.

The top three teams qualify for next week's state tournament. Crook County is in fourth at 369, 22 strokes behind Seaside, followed by Astoria (385), Banks (386), Molalla (387), Tillamook (392) and Corbett (423).

Tillamook's Carter Lee is atop the individual leaderboard with a 73, with Valley Catholic's Peter Boileau at 74. Seaside freshman Curtis Kunde is eighth with a first-round 81. Jackson Kunde is 12th with an 85, followed by Samson Sibony (90), Connor Merrell (91) and Mason Shamion (97).

"We came into today with a goal of getting back to the state tournament," said Seaside coach Jim Poetsch. "And while we didn't score very well, we put ourselves in a good position to meet that goal. We'd like to score a little better (Tuesday), but if we shoot the same and finish in the top three we will have done what we set out to accomplish this week."

"Curtis played a great round today," he said. "Usually it is the freshmen that succumb to the pressure of their first regional tournament, but he was the one who carried us today. The four upperclassmen all shot their season highs today."

Jackson Kunde "played a Jekyll and Hyde round today," Poetsch said. "He was even-par through six holes and leading the tournament. After a double bogey on the seventh he was still in the lead, but he let it get to him and he lost 12 strokes on the next six holes. After regaining his composure, he went on to play the final six holes in one-over par."

Astoria had four golfers in the 90s in Monday's round, led by Josh Olson with a 93. Connor Long shot a 96, followed by Dylan Altheide-Nielson (97), Taylor Palmberg (99) and Tryton Matlock (110).

In the girls' tournament — also at Quail Valley — the Astoria Lady Fishermen are in fourth place in the team standings, just outside the top three state qualifying spots.

Astoria shot a season-best 428 team score, beating their previous best by 25 shots.

Four players shot personal best scores, including Samantha Hemsley (91), Sarah Lertora (118), Sierra Adams (120) and Gracie Cummings (133). Jenna Travers posted a 99.

The girls' regional tournament also concludes Tuesday at Quail Valley.

US blanks Germany at hockey worlds

Canada, Russia rout opponents

HERNING, Denmark — The United States beat Germany 3-0 to stay unbeaten and Russia shut out a third straight opponent at the world ice hockey championship on Monday.

Russia routed Belarus 6-0.

Canada allowed Denmark to score on the way to another big win, 7-1, and defending champion Sweden kept cruising with a 4-0 win against France.

U.S. captain Patrick Kane broke the deadlock against Germany and assisted on the other two goals in the hard-fought Group B game in Herning.

Germany goalie Niklas Treutle didn't allow the U.S. to score from 11 shots on goal in the first period. Treutle's teammates also killed three penalties in the second period. Kane finally made the breakthrough midway through the game on another power play with a one-timer to the roof of the net.

"It was a great pass from Johnny (Gaudreau), it was fun to be on the

receiving end of that one," Kane said.

"It was a big goal. Zero-zero against a team like Germany that came out really strong and they kind of hanged around there."

Just over two minutes later, Derek Ryan added an insurance goal also on a power play. In the final period, Kane found his NHL teammate Alex DeBrincat in front of the net for the third goal.

"It's awesome to play with (Kane)," DeBrincat said. "He gets so many chances in a game. It's pretty hard not to score."

U.S. goalie Keith Kinkaid stopped 24 shots for his second straight shutout.

It was the third consecutive defeat for Germany, the runner-up at the Pyeongchang Olympics.

Joshua Bailey opened the scoring for Canada with a wrist on a power play, and defenseman Aaron Ekblad netted with a slap shot in the first period.

Jordan Eberle, Ryan O'Reilly and Ryan Nugent-Hopkins stretch the lead to 5-0 within a three-minute span.

Seahawks sign 5 tryout players following rookie camp

RENTON, Wash. — The Seattle Seahawks have signed five tryout players following their rookie minicamp, highlighted by wide receiver Damore'ea Stringfellow.

Seattle announced the roster moves Monday. Stringfellow started his college career at Washington before being

dismissed from the team and finishing at Mississippi. Stringfellow caught 46 passes for 716 yards and six touchdowns in his final year at Ole Miss. He was originally signed by Miami before being released and spent part of last year on the New York Jets practice squad.

Seattle also signed free safety Tevon Mutcherson, center Marcus

Henry, and tackles Nick Callender and Avery Young. Mutcherson played collegiately at Central Florida with Seahawks Shaquill and Shaquem Griffin, and spent part of last season with Houston.

Seattle released wide receivers Ka'Raun White and Taj Williams, linebackers Jason Hall and Paul Dawson, and center Brad Lundblade.

Astoria pounds Tillamook, 13-2

With two regular season games remaining, the Astoria and Banks baseball teams are on a collision course for a league championship.

The Braves and Fishermen remained locked in a first-place tie, as both scored wins Monday in Clatsop County.

While Banks was scoring a 10-0 victory at Seaside, the Fishermen knocked off Tillamook 13-2 at Tapiola Park.

Astoria plays Tuesday at Seaside, and Banks travels to Valley Catholic for a Wednesday game. The Fishermen and Braves close the league season Friday at Banks.

Astoria's Trey Hageman — the leading candidate for Cowapa League Player of the Year — was 3-for-4 at the plate, with a double, four RBIs and two runs scored.

He also threw a complete five-inning game, allowing five hits with five strikeouts and a walk.

Astoria had nine hits off two Tillamook pitchers, while the Cheesemakers helped Astoria's cause with five errors in the field. The Fishermen scored 10 runs in the second inning to secure the win.

Banks blanks Seaside, 10-0

SEASIDE — Banks built a quick 5-0 lead Monday on its way to a 10-0 Cowapa League baseball win over Seaside at Broadway Field.

The Braves collected 11 hits, while Banks starter Blake Gobel silenced the Seaside bats to help the Braves remain in a first-place tie with Astoria.

Gobel had just one strikeout, but he had the Seaside batters off-balance and hitting lots of fly balls. The Gulls had four base hits, while Gobel walked one and threw six solid innings (59 pitches) before giving way to Tyler Lilly in the seventh.

Meanwhile, the Braves scored two runs in the first and added three in the second, highlighted by a two-run single from Dakota Bunn.

Hayden Vandehey had three singles for Banks, and also drove in three runs.

Seaside pitchers Payton Westerholm and Gage McFadden combined for three strikeouts and four walks. A pair of double plays helped the Gulls get out of a couple jams, but the Braves also turned two double plays, including one in the sixth when the first two Seaside batters reached base.
