## Astoria man killed in head-on collision on Highway 101

One person was killed and two were injured in a head-on collision that closed U.S. Highway 101 near Gearhart Tuesday evening.

At about 5:30 p.m., Dale Edward Larson, 84, of Astoria, died after crossing the centerline around milepost 15 and colliding into a black pickup truck traveling northbound, Oregon State Police Sgt. Andrew Merila said.

Larson was not wearing a seat belt at the time of the accident, according to Oregon State Police.

The driver of the black truck, Jesse Gale Taylor of Seaside, and a passenger were sent to Columbia Memorial Hospital in Astoria for minor injuries. The crash occurred about 4 miles north of Gearhart. The highway was closed for a few hours as officials cleaned up and investigated the scene.

John Sandsted passed away on April 24, 2018, at Samaritan Evergreen Hospice in Albany, Oregon, following a brief battle with mesothelioma.

John was born in Portland, Oregon, on Dec. 23, 1935, to Peter and Frances Sandsted. After attending Benson High School in Portland, John went to work as a plumber for Industrial Plumbing, which was owned by his family.

Due to disabilities that John faced, his mother was fiercely devoted to him. John and his mother loved to go boating on the Columbia River with a large group of friends, and in the early 1970s they bought a home in Cannon Beach. They enjoyed clam digging and had a beautiful collection of Japanese glass floats. John took care of his mother until she lost her battle with cancer. John enjoyed helping others, and spent years driving friends to doctor appointments.

Friends and neighbors were surprised when John announced that at the age of 62 he would be marrying for the first time. John married Marjorie Quarles in 1998, and enjoyed having four stepchildren. He found his greatest joy in being

a grandfather. John was a skilled woodworker and made beautiful pieces of furniture for his grandchildren.

Marge and John attended North Coast Family Fellowship, and were active in the Bible study for seniors. In 2004, John and Marge rebuilt Sea Breeze Court in Cannon Beach, and he took great pride in his work at the motel. After Marge had a stroke, John would take time away from the motel to go to the nursing home to help her eat her meals. Marge passed away May 22, 2017.

John is survived by his stepchildren, Janice Filley (Dave) of Albany, Oregon, Ken Quarles (Stephanie) of Cannon Beach, Oregon, Bev Buschert (Matt) of Tualatin, Oregon, and Nancy Pannel (George) of Henderson, Nevada. John had nine grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. He is also survived by his beloved dachshund, Bernie.

Cannon Beach has always had a cast of colorful characters, and John fit perfectly into this cast. He will be greatly missed.

## State fines Seaside quarry over stormwater

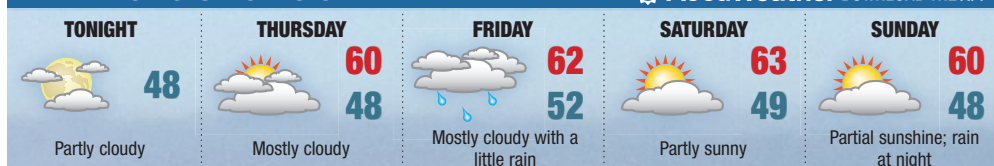
SEASIDE — The state Department of Environmental Quality fined Road Builders Inc. \$10,227 for failing to monitor storm-

water runoff at the Humbug Quarry near Seaside for pollutants.

Road Builders' stormwater permit requires the company to monitor stormwater runoff four times per year

and submit results to the Department of Geology and Mineral Industries annually. The company has had a permit since 2013 but hasn't submitted the required reports.

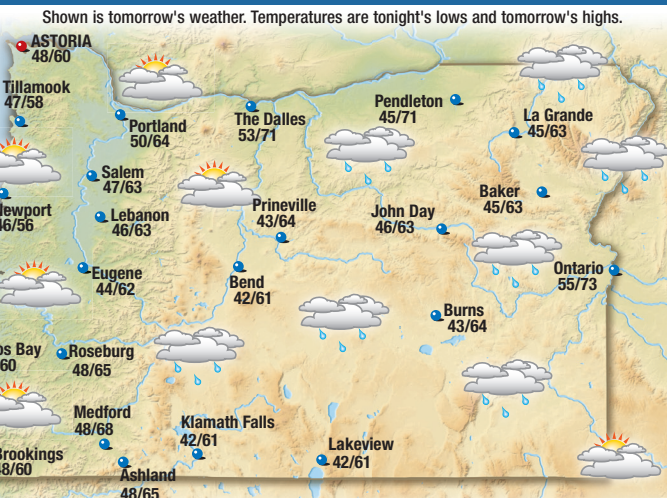

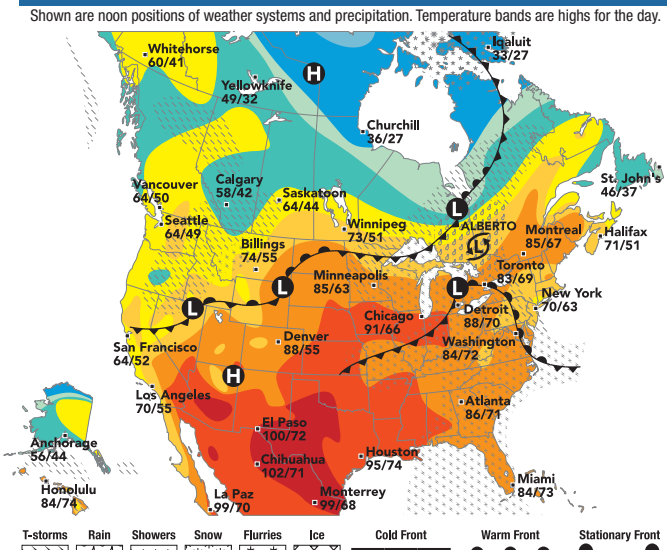
