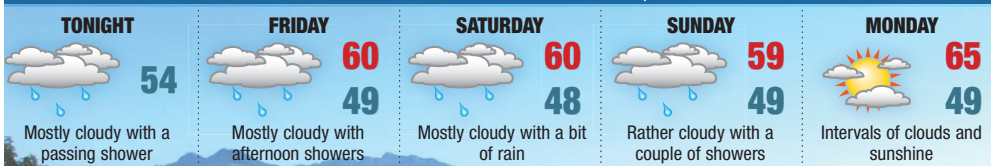

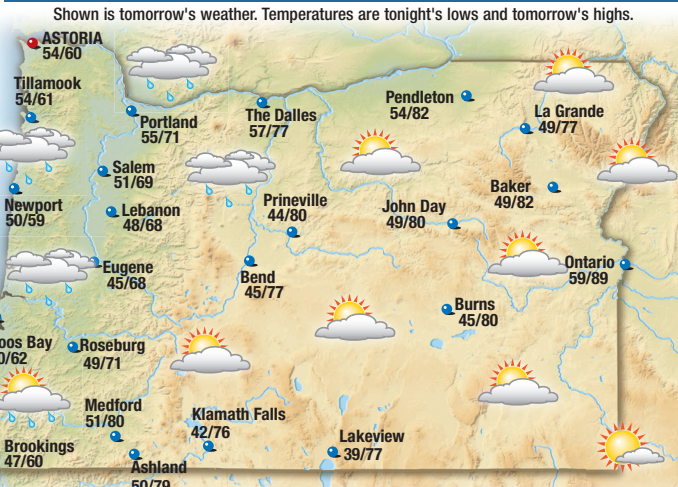

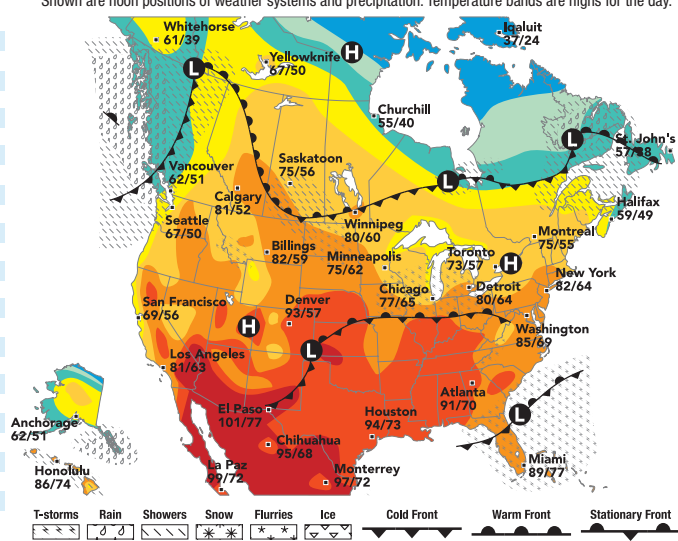

 May 28, 1949 — April 8, 2018

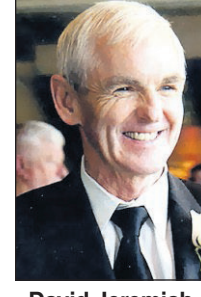


David Lee Jeremiah was born on May 28, 1949 in Tulare, California, to Clinton and Olus Jeremiah. Most of his growing up years were spent in Oregon, and he graduated from Seaside High School with the Class of 1968.

He returned to Gillette in 2017, where he lived until his passing. He was a long-term member of First United Methodist Church.

He joined the Navy that same year and served aboard the USS Casimir Pulaski, a James Madison-class ballistic missile nuclear submarine. While aboard the USS Casimir Pulaski, Dave completed two patrols in the North Atlantic in support of Cold War operations. He loved telling about how he'd listened to Neil Armstrong walk on the moon while their sub was deep below the polar ice caps. He received an honorable discharge and left active duty in 1972. He eventually arrived in Gillette, Wyoming, where he worked as a control electrician for PacifiCorp until he retired in 2004. After retirement he spent time in Portland, Oregon, Panama City Beach, Florida, and Spanish

Fort, Alabama. He returned to Gillette in 2017, where he lived until his passing. He was a long-term member of First United Methodist Church. Dave was always active and enjoyed hiking in the Big Horn Mountains, fishing, being near the ocean, and traveling the world. He was an amazing father, and would do anything he could for his kids and grandchildren.
