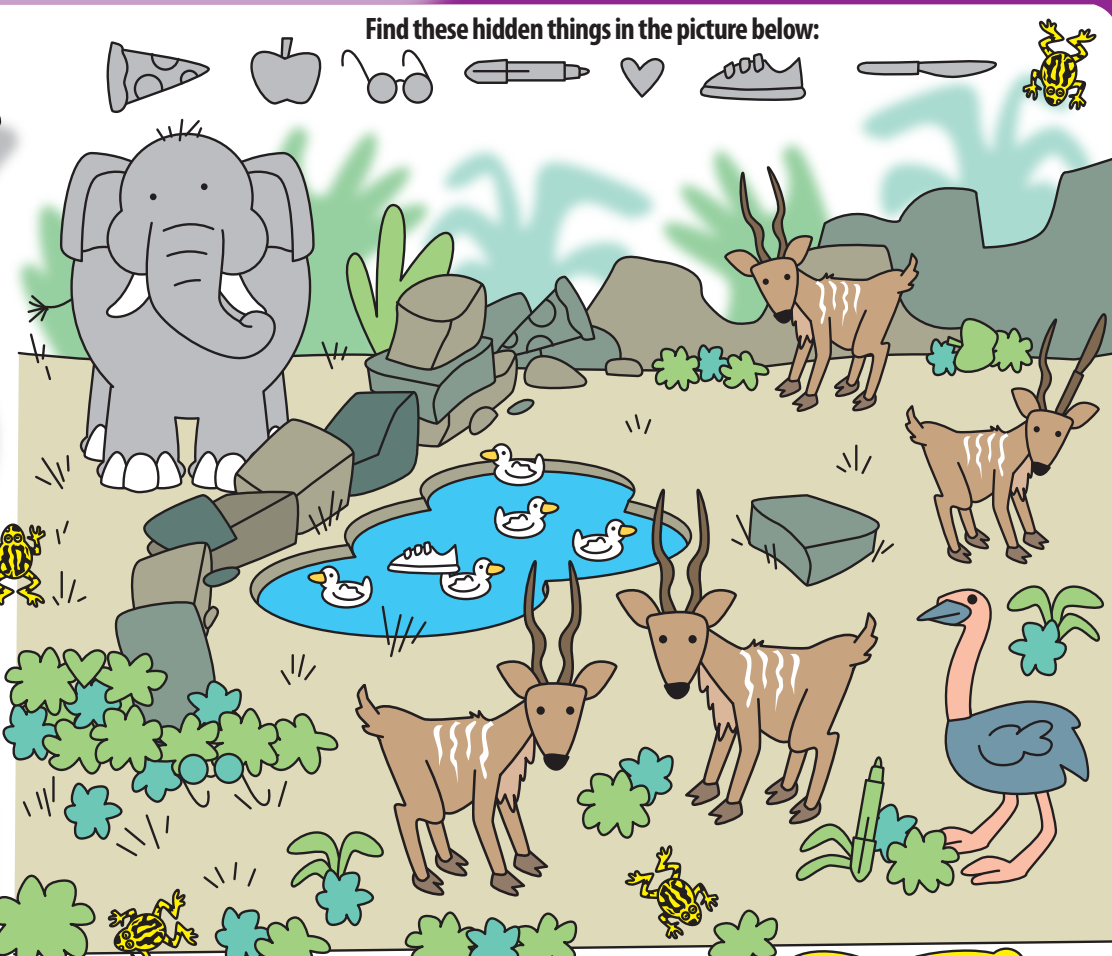

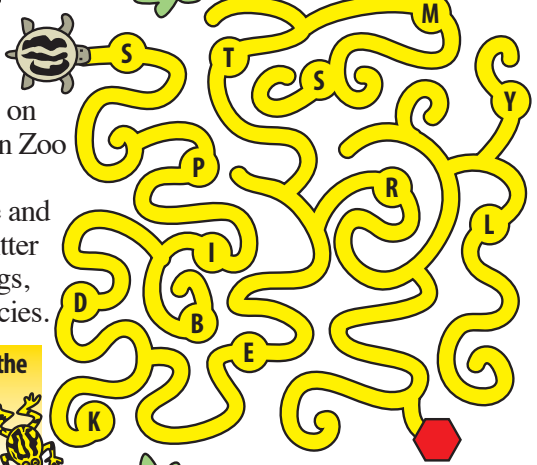


Tiny Tortoise Saved?

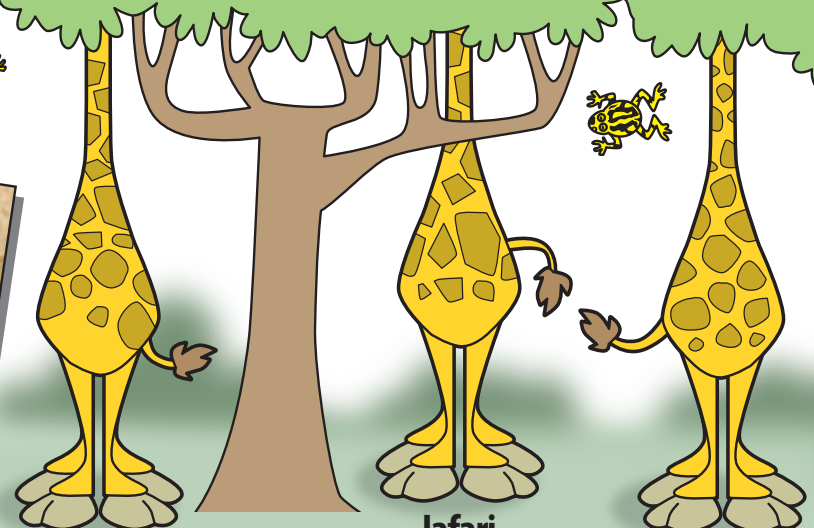
California condors can live more than 50 years in the wild. They can now be found in California, Arizona and Baja California, Mexico.

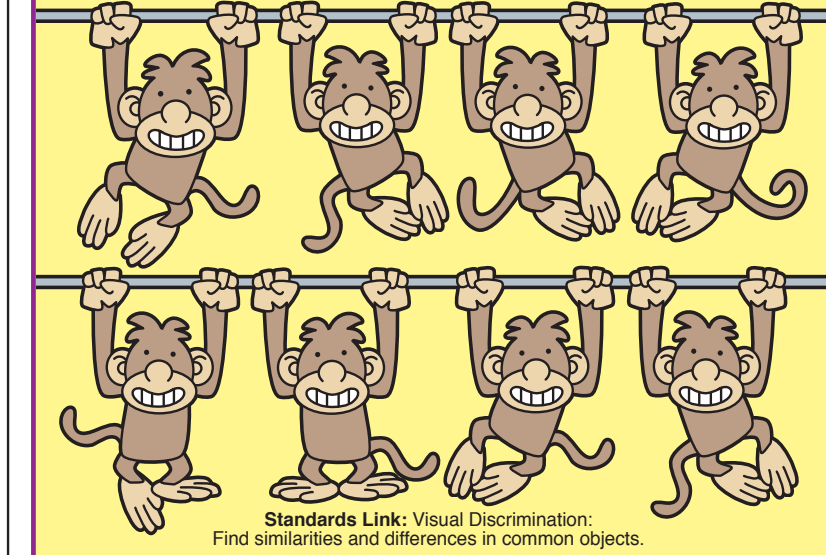
