Power outage in Warrenton on Saturday

WARRENTON—Approximately 3,100 Pacific Power customers in the Warrenton and Hammond area will be without electricity during the early morning hours Saturday, as crews upgrade essen-

tial equipment to increase capacity and improve reliability.

The outage is scheduled just before midnight Friday, and could last until 6:30 a.m. Saturday, although power will be restored at the first opportunity. Customers in the

affected area have been notified individually about the outage.

College faces falling wall

Clatsop Community College could be facing an expensive repair of a deteriorating rock wall in front of Towler Hall on its main campus.

The rock wall, several feet tall, fronts Towler Hall on Jerome Avenue and 16th Street, holding back the building's front yard. It has been in place since before the college, when Astoria High School was located at the corner.

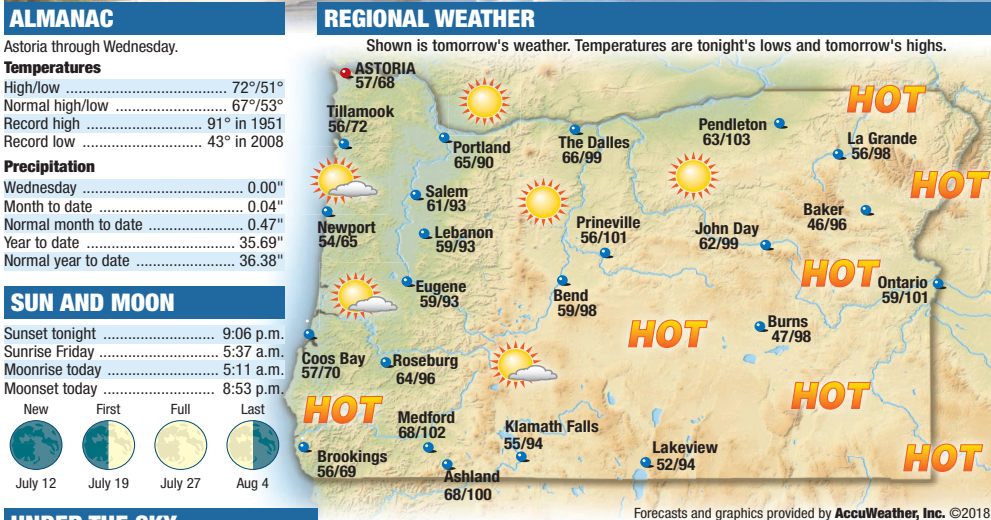
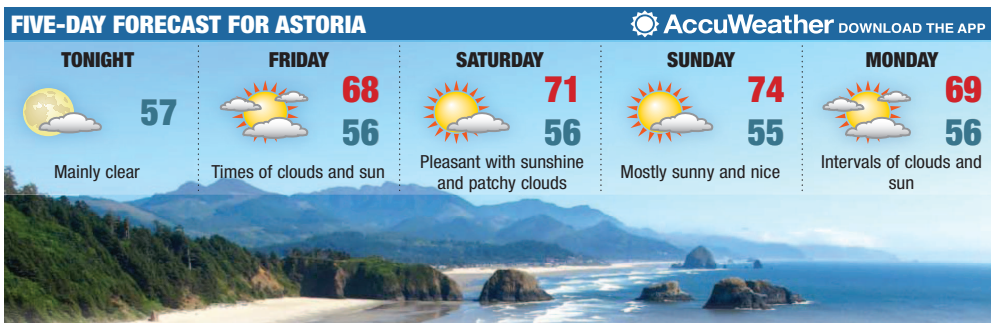
"It's a combination of heavy rains and weather-re-

lated wear and tear on a very old wall," said JoAnn Zahn, the college's vice president of finance and operations. "Some of the very heavy basalt rock came off the top, which if that were to hit someone would be devastating."

Christopher Breitmeyer, the college president, said maintenance staff first noticed issues in August, near the end of the Patriot Hall redevelopment project. The college had a cyclone fence in front of the site during the construction but kept it in place to protect passers-by from any falling rock.

The college initially discussed having its historic preservation program repair the wall but decided it would be too difficult to do in-house, Zahn said. The entire wall needs to be looked at because of the potential failure, she said.

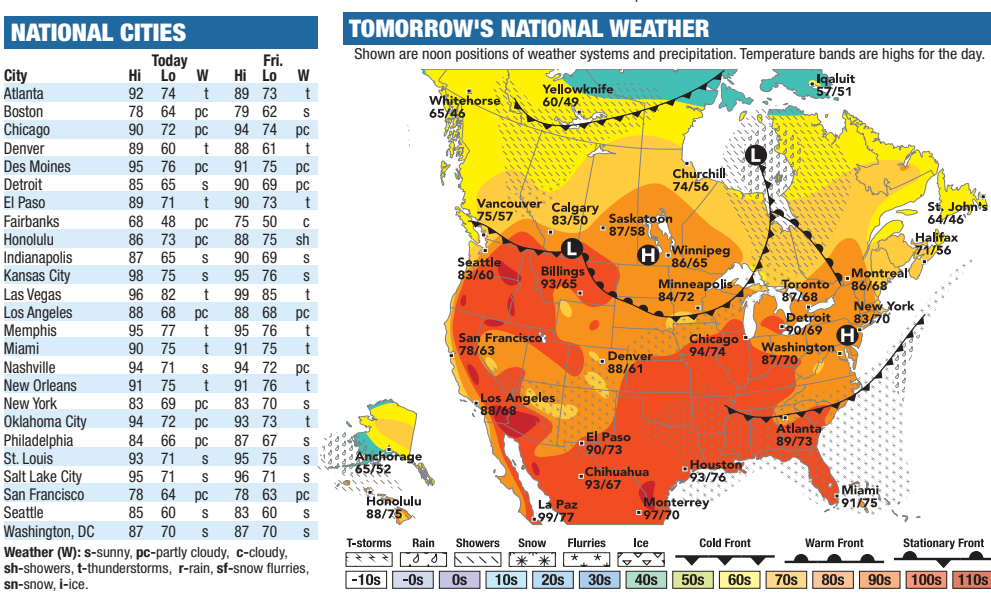
The college board voted Tuesday to have staff seek proposals for fixing the wall, with the cost expected to be in the hundreds of thousands of dollars. The college will bring back the findings to the board before moving forward with a fix.

William Gray McLaughlin was born to Grant and Imogene McLaughlin of Waynesboro, Virginia, on Aug. 5, 1947. He passed away in Portland, Oregon, on July 8, 2018, at the age of 70, after an 18-year battle with war-related lymphoma.

"Mac," as everyone called him, is survived by his wife of 34 years, Rainey Carlson of Knappa/Svensen, and his son, Troy Grant McLaughlin, of Salcha, Alaska.

He was deployed all over the world, including Europe, Africa, the Middle East and two tours in Vietnam. He was a paratrooper in the Special Forces Group with well over 2,000 jumps, finally completing his career as a master sergeant in the 1st Special Forces Group at Fort Lewis, Washington.

After retiring from the military, Mac worked for the U.S. Postal Service in Portland, Oregon, as a postal carrier for 20 years.

His passions were hunting, fishing, camping, clam digging and taxidermy. Mac had a knack for making friends easily. He loved Oregon, and most of all, his family.

There will be a viewing/visitation at Hughes Ransom Mortuary Chapel in Astoria, Monday, July 16, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. A graveside service is scheduled for Tuesday, July 17, at 11 a.m. A reception to celebrate Mac's life will follow at his home in Svensen.
