The Astoria Scandinavian Heritage Association announced it has selected The West Studio of Seattle as landscape architect for the Scandinavian Heritage Park it intends to build on the Astoria Riverwalk between 15th and 16th streets. The public space will commemorate the contributions and influences of the Scandinavian community to the general identity of the region.

The West Studio design team will work with city of Astoria officials and members of the local Scandinavian community to create and revise a design for the park to bring to the city council for approval in late 2018 or early 2019.
