ASTORIA — The Astoria Second Saturday Art Walk, a chance to check out the city's artistic offerings, takes place 5 to 8 p.m. Aug. 11. 1. WineKraft

80 10th St. (Pier 11)

Featuring work from six local artists as well as live music starting at 7 p.m. Sip wine, eat and enjoy the arts as you wrap up your art walking.

2. Paul Polson Gallery

100 10th St.

Showing a retrospective from the late 1980s to the present: landscapes and a popular series of strata paintings. These were mostly painted in the early 1990s and depict layers of the earth intertwined with levels of the mind and its tiers of consciousness.

3. McVarish Gallery

1060 10th St.

McVarish Gallery features the etchings of Joshua Jay Johnson in which individuals traverse harsh post-civilized landscapes performing extreme acts of violence and debauchery. Bloody, but done in a breathtakingly beautiful Renaissance style.

4. KALA

"Venerations," the new works by Seattle-based artist Paul Soriano. Each oil painting focuses on a Buddha image and are works of devotion, meditation and prayer.
