# Josi, a Democrat, backs Lower, a Republican, in state House race

## Tillamook commissioner lost primary

A former Democratic candidate for state House District 32 has endorsed Republican Vineeta Lower for the seat in the November election.

Tillamook County Commissioner Tim Josi announced the endorsement Wednesday. He, along with Gearhart lawyer John Orr, lost the May primary to Tiffany Mitchell, a case management coordinator with the state Department of Human Services.

"From Astoria to Banks on down to Tillamook, the voters in House District 32 have always been willing to look beyond party labels to support candidates who will do the most good for our communities," Josi said in a statement. "Vineeta's experience as a teacher, her background in the transportation sector and her commitment to putting

the priorities of neighbors ahead of partisan politics makes her the most qualified candidate in this race."

Lower said she is "extremely humbled" by the endorsement. "Our state is facing some tremendous challenges. If we are going to solve them, we have to work together with members of both parties and identify the solutions that

will best benefit Oregonians," she said in a statement.

Lower and Mitchell are vying for the seat held by Rep. Deborah Boone, D-Cannon Beach, who was first elected to the House in 2004. Boone and state Sen. Betsy Johnson, D-Scappoose, endorsed Josi — a former state representative — in the primary.

# Scandinavian, theater groups receive grants from cultural trust

The Liberty Theatre and Scandinavian Heritage Park were among the community projects to receive support from the Oregon Cultural Trust.

The Astoria Scandinavian Heritage Association received \$17,114 to support the development and design of the new heritage park. The Astoria City Council gave the group permission to design a monument

at the Peoples Park downtown.

Liberty Restoration Inc. received \$10,395 for a project to improve stage support. The theater is embarking on a multiyear \$5 million capital campaign to modernize performance spaces and the theatergoing experience.

"This project will add desperately needed rigging, lighting, and curtains to our stage, plus box office and concessions renovations, while also addressing deferred preserva-

tion maintenance and energy efficiency upgrades throughout the theater," said Jennifer Crockett, the theater's executive director.

The restoration group also recently received \$2,500 from US Bank to fund a classical music series and school workshops.

The two Astoria projects are part of more than \$3 million in grants being awarded to 137 groups by the trust over the coming year.
