

Forest Grove man arrested after Highway 26 pursuit

A Forest Grove man was arrested on a host of charges Monday after allegedly leading police on a car chase in the southeastern part of Clatsop County.

Oregon State Police attempted to locate a black Mercedes with a Hawaii license plate Monday morning. After eluding officers in Banks, the car was spotted traveling westbound on U.S. Highway 26.

A trooper followed the car until it pulled into the Baker's General Store parking lot just east of Elsie. The trooper

attempted to block the car, but it accelerated, made a U-turn and turned east onto the highway. After chasing the car for about a mile with lights and sirens, the trooper ended the pursuit.

Another trooper set up spike strips on the highway about 15 miles east in Washington County. After hitting the strips, the car's speed increased to over 80 mph. But the driver's side tires became flat about 1½ miles later, forcing the car to stop.

When police approached the car, they attempted to arrest Logan Ikaika Franco, 30. He allegedly resisted arrest, and troopers used a

stun gun on him. After the arrest, troopers recovered a large chunk of cash and suspected methamphetamine.

Franco was taken to the Washington County Jail and faces charges of driving under the influence of intoxicants, attempting to elude, resisting arrest, reckless driving, possession of methamphetamine, delivery of methamphetamine and driving while suspended.

Franco was convicted earlier this year of attempting to elude and reckless endangerment stemming from an incident in Yamhill County. In addition to the new charges, he also faces an alleged parole violation.

Oregon settles lawsuit over stormwater pollution rules

Oregon's Department of Environmental Quality has settled a lawsuit that environmental groups filed over the state's regulation of stormwater pollution.

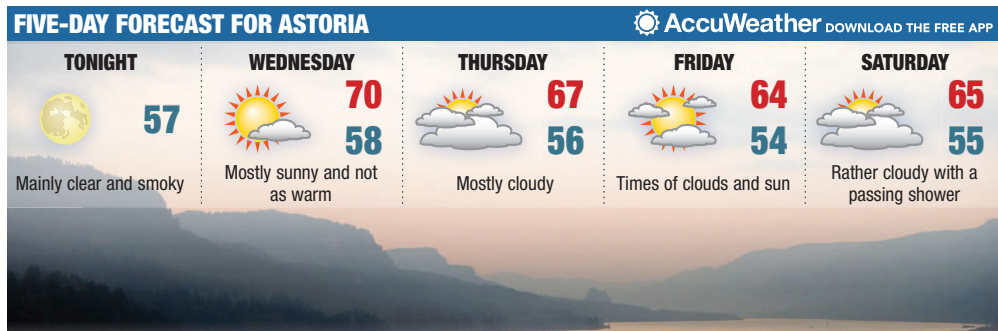
When it rains, water runs

over industrial sites and collects toxics like copper, lead and zinc, which then wash into rivers and streams. This kind of pollution has become a major source of contaminants across the country.

The settlement adds special protections for rivers and streams that are already too polluted for salmon, drink-

ing water or swimming. Previously, the state treated permits for those waters no differently than permits to discharge into cleaner rivers.

"A real focus of our settlement this time around is trying to clean up the water that already has too much pollution in it," said attorney Jamie Saul with Earthrise Law Center.

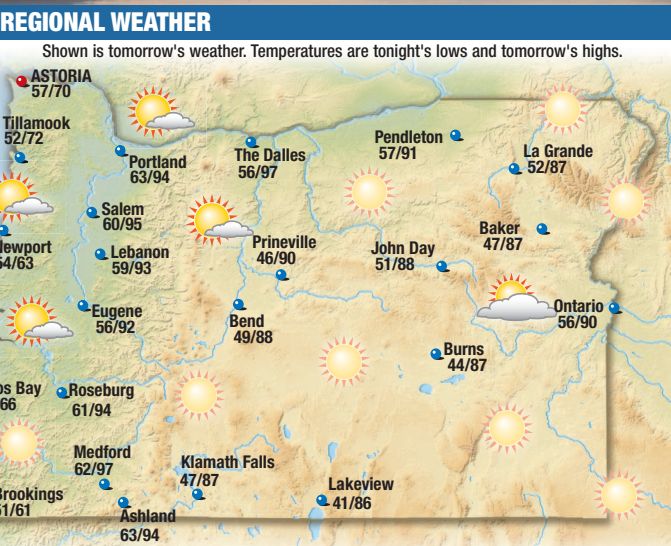

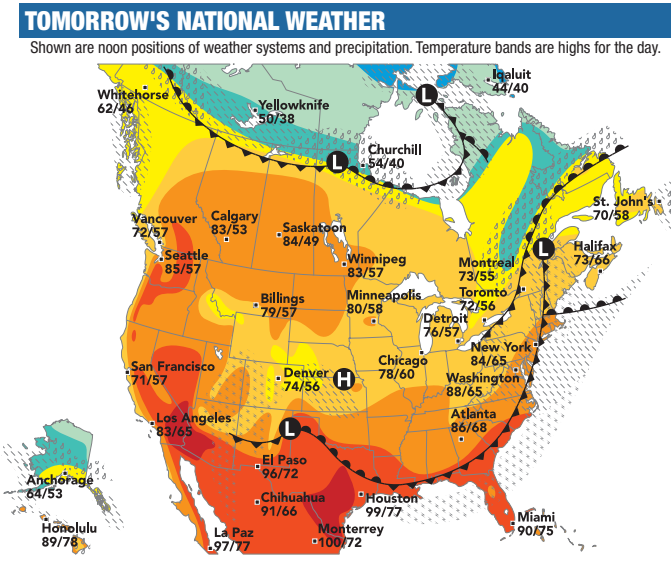
