Enjoy playing various games — disc golf with prizes, corn hole, badminton

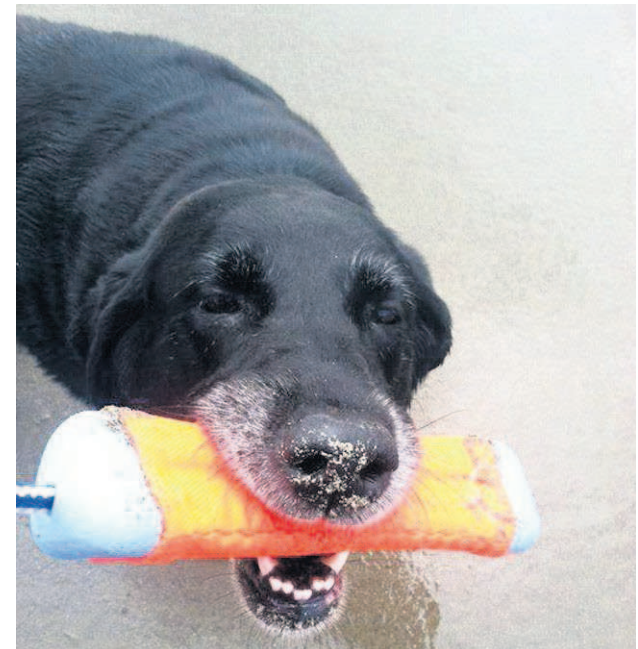
— attend JR Ranger programs, experience history on a free guided truck or battery tour, and get your picture taken with JR Beaver!
