Art-in-the-Loft at Beach Books presents Consu Tolosa, a mixed-me-

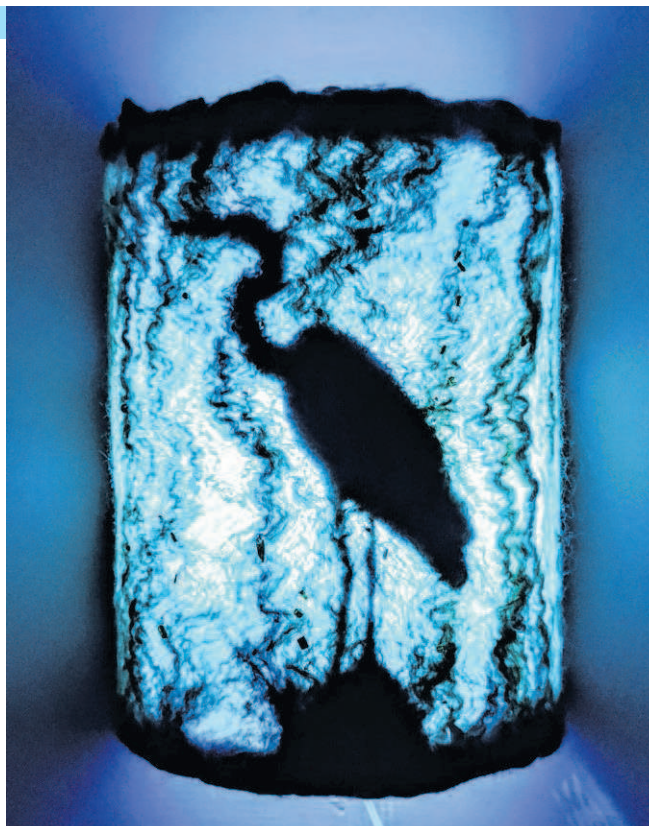
