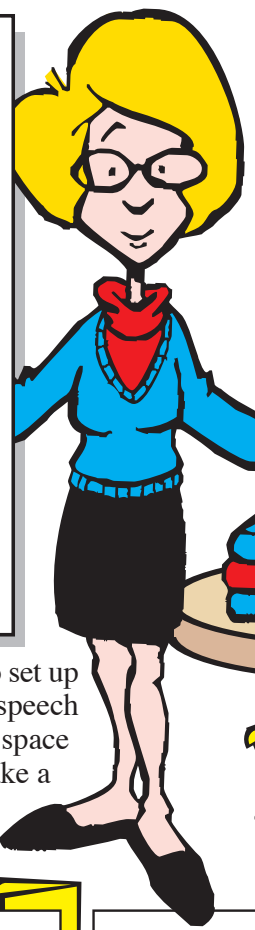

What do YOU think?

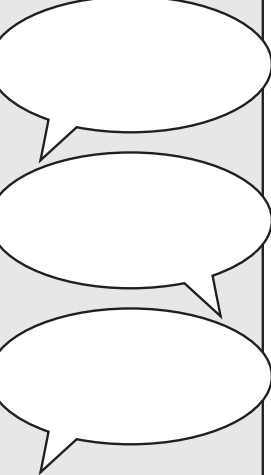
Should students be allowed to wear to school t-shirts that say rude things?
