BEND — A candidate for the Oregon House of Representatives who was accused of making a false statement about her education in the official voter guide has dropped

out of the race.

Working Families Party candidate for the 54th House District Amanda La Bell notified the party Wednesday of her decision to end her campaign.

La Bell wrote in the state Voters Pamphlet that she

earned a bachelor's degree from Valdosta State University in Georgia.

But The Bulletin of Bend says she actually left the college after one semester in order to work, and does not have a degree.

After graduating from high school, he found another talent in masonry — working with granite and marble — and eventually he combined it with wood. He was a gifted craftsman.

He spent all his spare time with his beloved dog, Shep. They could be found playing fetch at the beach, searching for driftwood or hiking

in the woods. His love for animals and the outdoors was seen by all. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, hiking target shooting and searching for mushrooms.

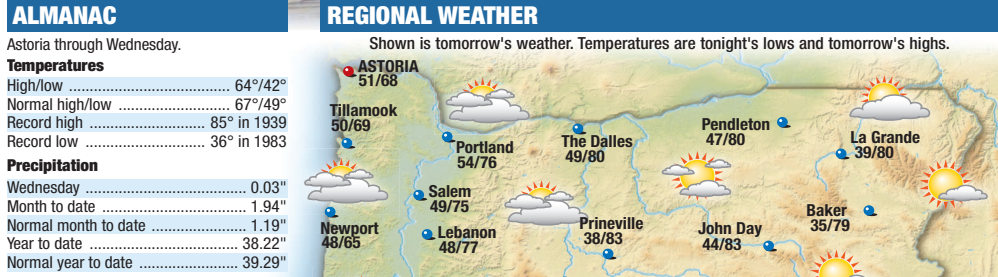
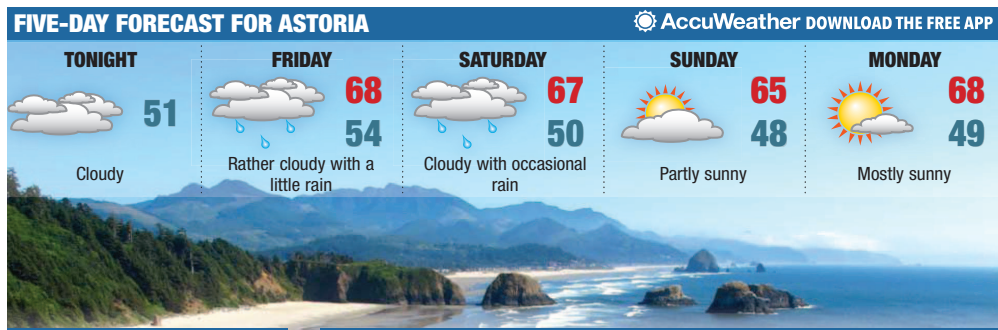
He was preceded in death by grandparents Reino Vedenoja, Norman Daly and Georgene McCuiston.

In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to the Oregon Humane Society or a charity of your choice.

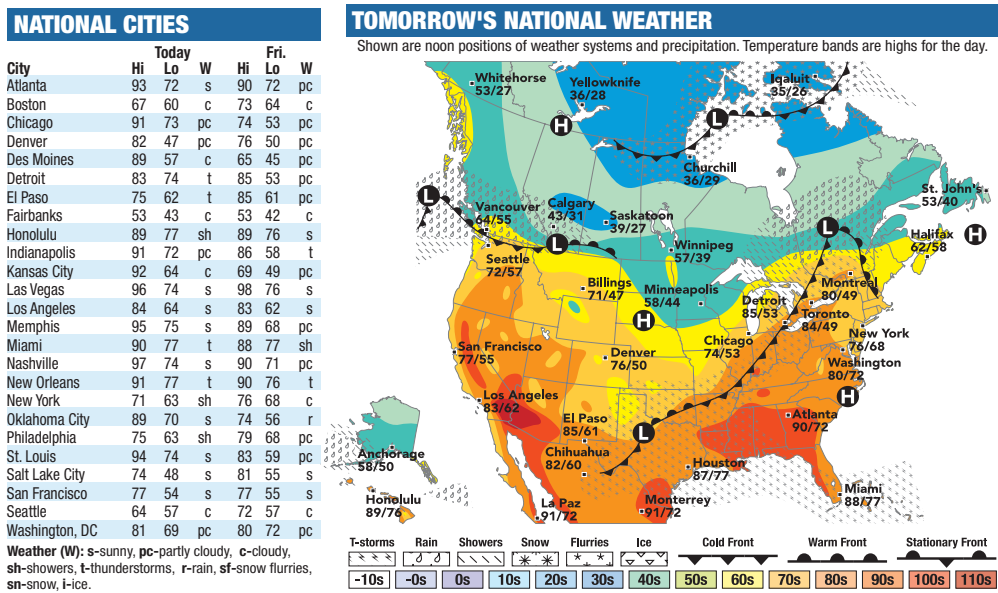
