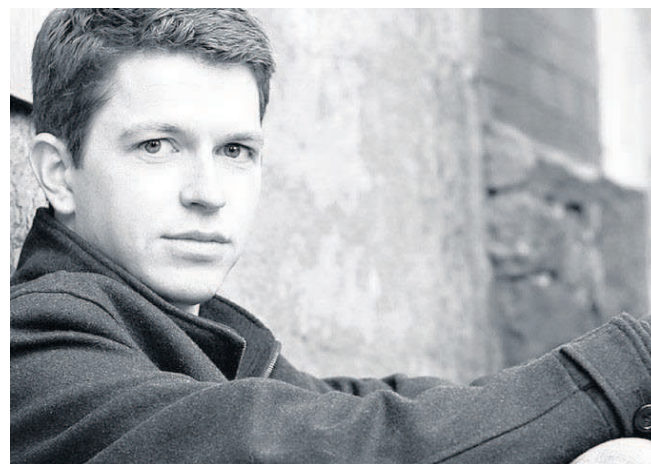
Beus will perform an all-classical concert in memory of the CEO of Escape Lodging, Tom Drumheller, who died a year ago this month.
