

# Man allegedly pulled a knife on Clemente's owner

Two people were arrested Thursday after allegedly leaving Clemente's Seafood without paying, leading one man to later pull a knife on the restaurant's owner.

Jeremy Dylan Cordi, 33, of Portland, and Stephanie A. Saldana, 34, of Wilsonville, were eating at the restaurant when they went outside, saying they were taking a

smoke break. Saldana walked away from the restaurant, and Cordi allegedly did the same soon after.

Gordon Clement, the restaurant's owner, began chasing Cordi after seeing him leave. After Clement cornered him a couple of blocks away, Cordi allegedly pulled out a knife.

Astoria police officers arrived moments later and

arrested Cordi. He was taken to the Clatsop County Jail and charged with unlawful possession of a weapon with intent to use, menacing and third-degree theft.

Police also cited and released Saldana on a third-degree theft charge.

Clement co-owns the restaurant with his wife, Clatsop County Commissioner Lisa Clement.

# Astoria Bridge closes Sunday for Great Columbia Crossing

The Astoria Bridge is closed to all motorists from 8:30 to 11 a.m. Sunday for the 36th annual Great Columbia Crossing 10K.

This year is the first time that the entire bridge will be closed for the event.

In addition, vehicles are not allowed to line up to wait to cross the bridge on either the Oregon or Washington state side. Motorists will be dispersed and directed away from the bridge during the event.

In order to get the bridge open by 11 a.m., partici-

pants still on the bridge at 10:50 a.m. will be picked up by shuttle bus to clear the bridge.

A possible detour route during the closure is using the Lewis and Clark Bridge that connects U.S. Highway 30 and State Route 4 at Rainier and Longview, Washington.
