Meriwether Lewis: 'no regular botanist'

FORT CLATSOP — Lewis and Clark National Historical Park, Fort Clatsop, is pleased to announce the next In Their Footsteps free speaker series event.

"Altho' no regular botanist" — President Thomas Jefferson's Reference to Meriwether Lewis — with Carol Lucas takes place at 1 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 21. in the Netul River Room of the visitor center.

It would have been customary for Jefferson to have sent a botanist on the Lewis and Clark Expedition. A primary purpose of the trip was to assess what resources, including plants, were in the lands to the west. Jefferson knew Lewis and that, "Altho' no regular botanist," Lewis had the ability to catalog plant discoveries, due mostly to his herbal knowledge.

Lucas is an herbalist in Gearhart.
