Dear Annie: Last year, I wrote to you about my beautiful 35-yearold daughter and the kidney transplant she'd just received through the United Network for Organ Sharing. I am "A Very Grateful Mom." My daughter continues to do well and

is leading a healthy life. We would like to thank the donor family, but my letter sent to them through the donor channels was never responded to. It's been over a year and a half since my daughter received the lifesaving kidney, and we hope that someday the donor family reaches out to her so a proper thank-you can be given.

However, all is not good with her family. My teenage granddaughter has now been diagnosed with the same rare kidney disease her mother, my daughter, was diagnosed with. Although we know that it's a rare genetic one, we have no idea where it came from through the family. This disease has no cure or treatment. The only solution is a transplant when kidney function declines to that point. Our hope is that it will be years before my granddaughter will need a transplant. Please remind your readers about how important it is to be an organ donor.

One of the first things I did after my daughter's successful transplant (and witnessing how much better she felt) was to check the box on my driver's license. — Still a Very Grateful Mom
