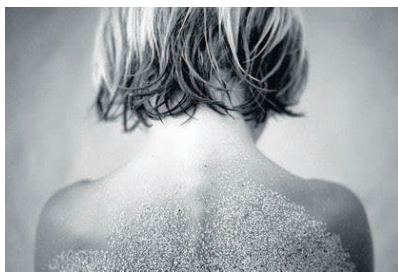


'Son,' by Tone Elin Solholm, on view at LightBox Photographic Gallery.

As the program remembers the "horrible" weather as noted by the Corps of Discovery in 1805, we also remember the horrors of the 1918 flu pandemic.

At 2 p.m. we present the program "100 Years Ago: Remembering the

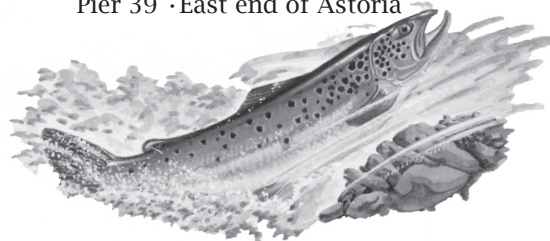
