PROGRAM OVERVIEW

South Pacific County Humane Society (SPCHS) administers an array of programs to address the problem of homeless pets. These programs provide a continuum of services for preventing pet homelessness and caring for and re-homing pets in need.

- SPCHS finds forever homes for stray and surrendered cats and dogs in South Pacific County and provides them shelter, food, socialization, vaccinations, spay/neuter, and medical care until their forever home is found.
- SPCHS assists low-income households in caring for their pets with a voucher program for low-cost spay/neuters and with a Pet Food Bank.
- SPCHS supports humane management of Community/Feral cat colonies with loaning of traps for Trap, Neuter, Return (TNR) and a \$7.50 spay/neuter co-pay program.
- SPCHS provides licensing of pets for the cities of Long Beach and Ilwaco.
- SPCHS provides education and support for pets in neglected situations.
- SPCHS provides boarding on a limited basis as space is available.
