

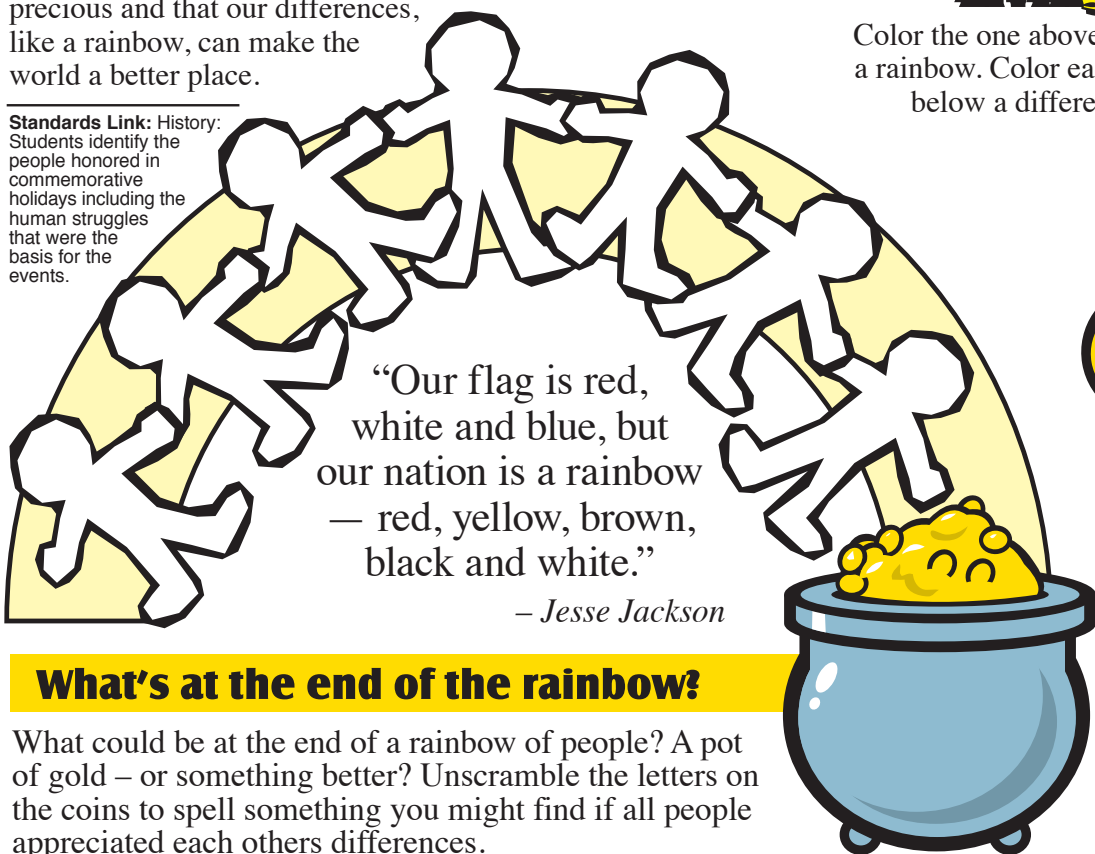
RAINBOW POWER

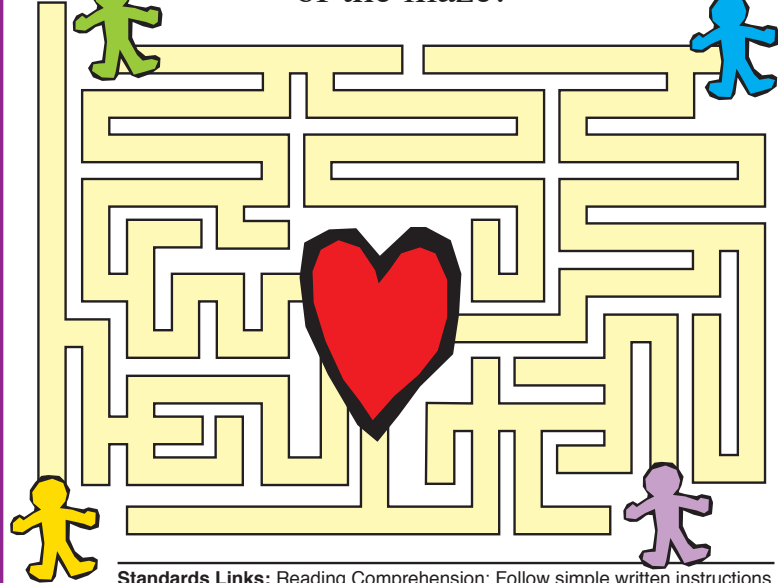
