

County seeks citizen help with budgets

Clatsop County is looking for people to serve on budget committees for the county and local road, sewer and extension service districts.

Citizen committees review proposed budgets and make recommendations to the Clatsop County commission. Each committee is made up of five county commissioners and five appointed local residents. They generally meet in May to review the proposed budgets.

The Clatsop County Budget Committee has two full terms, each ending Feb. 28, 2023. The committee reviews the county's overall operating budget.

One is for District 4 stretching from eastern Astoria to the east border of the county, including Alderbrook, Knappa, Svensen, Brownsmead and Westport. The other is for District 5 covering South County, including Cannon Beach, Arch Cape, Elsie, Hamlet, Jewell and portions of Seaside. It is preferred but not required that the applicants live within the district they represent.

The Road District 1 Budget Committee has three full terms ending Feb. 28, 2023, and two unexpired terms ending Feb. 28, 2022. The committee reviews the district's budget for roadwork on 220 miles of county roads. Applicants must live

in the unincorporated areas of the county.

The Westport Sewer Service District Budget Committee has three full terms ending Feb. 28, 2023, and two unexpired terms ending June 30, 2022, available to residents of the sewer district, which serves about 91 connections in Westport.

The 4-H & Extension District Budget Committee has three full terms ending Feb. 28, 2023.

She was a loving and dedicated mother and grandmother. Her family was always her priority. She had a love for animals, gardening and traveling. In her later years, she kept busy

researching family genealogy and volunteering for various organizations on the Oregon Coast.

Around 11:30 p.m. Sunday, police were dispatched to the scene. An initial

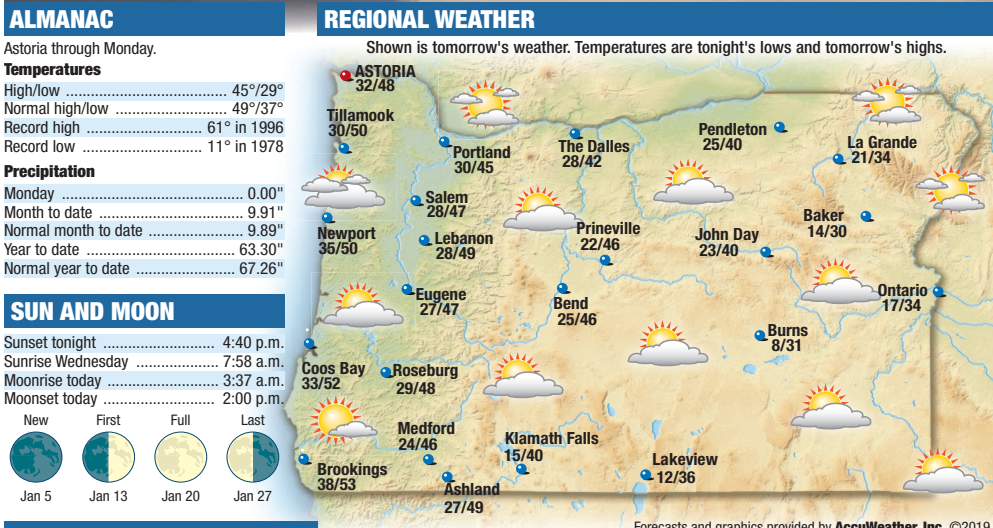
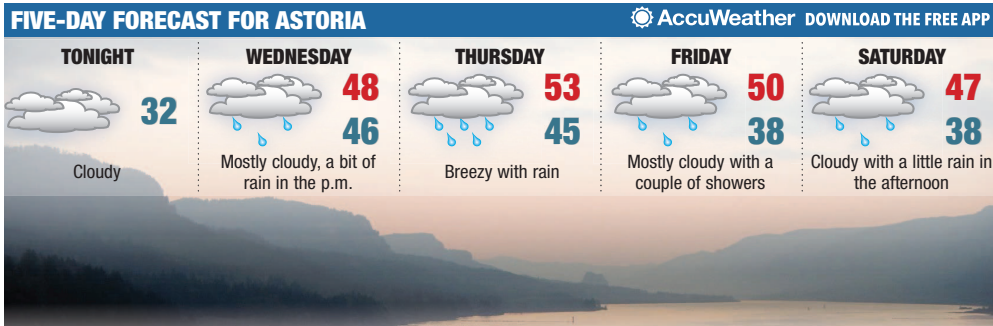

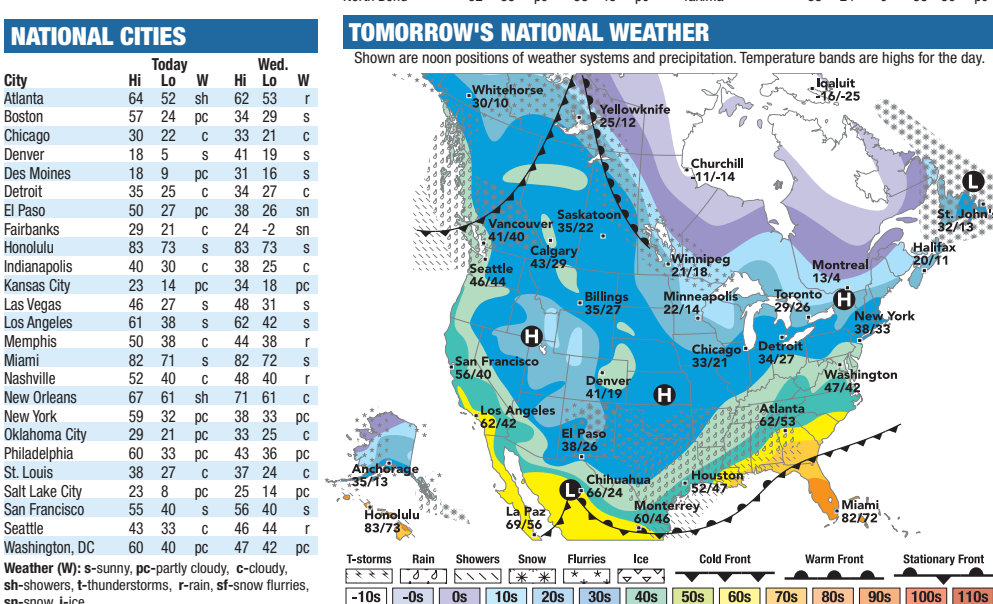

Laura May Ihander was born on Jan. 2, 1920, to Mary Hilda and Louis Paul Ihander, the third of six children. She graduated from Astoria High School in 1938, and remained a resident of Astoria her entire life.

Laura married Floyd Reith Jr. on Oct. 11, 1941, and they were the parents of three children, Patricia, Jeanyse and Arthur.

In her younger years, Laura worked as a licensed practical nurse, a clerk for the maritime administration and for Ed Luoma, CPA. After her children finished their education, Laura realized her dream of becoming a registered nurse, attending Clatsop College and the University of Oregon School of Nursing (now Oregon Health & Science University).

She worked in the intensive care unit at Columbia Memorial Hospital in Astoria after graduation in 1976, eventually becoming night supervisor, a position she held until her retirement in 1995. During these years, she and Floyd enjoyed winters in Yuma, Arizona, where Laura worked as a nurse at Yuma Regional Medical Center and for Hospice of Yuma, ultimately volunteering for both.

Laura was an active member of Anchors and the American Legion Auxiliary; she was a scout leader, and in later years enjoyed playing duplicate bridge both in Astoria and Yuma.

She also volunteered as a camp nurse at Camp Magruder for five years. A longtime member of Astoria's First Presbyterian Church, built by her grandfather Eric Gustafson, Laura served as a deacon and volunteered for the food bank.

Laura died on Dec. 25, 2018. She is survived by her children, Patricia Krumm (Charles Rogers), Jeanyse Snow and Arthur (Art) Reith (Randy); numerous grandchildren, great- and great-great-grandchildren; many nieces and nephews; and her brother-in-law, Melvin Graeber, and sister-in-law, Janice Ihander.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Floyd; her parents and siblings, Louise (Paetow), Florence (Colby), Carol (Graeber), Albin (Abby) Ihander and Frederick Ihander; and sons-in-law, Donald Krumm and Harold "Hal" Snow.
