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# Balancing public access and conservation: a discussion

SEASIDE — The Necanicum Watershed Council welcomes you to “Conservation Land and Public Access: The Pros and Cons, Join the Discussion,” 6 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 16, at the Seaside Public Library. Doors open at 5:30 p.m.

Katie Voelke, executive director of the North Coast Land Conservancy, leads an open-ended discussion about how to balance the needs of people, plants and wildlife in conserved lands on the Oregon Coast.

The Land Conservancy is working on its biggest project ever: conservation of 3,500 acres of forestland above Oswald West State Park to benefit people, plants and wildlife. So what is the right amount of public access for this prop-
