State Rep. Mitchell takes on health care, human services and housing

New state Rep. Tiffany Mitchell will serve on the House committees on health care, human services and housing.

Mitchell, D-Astoria, was recently sworn into the state Legislature, replacing Deborah Boone.

"I know how difficult the lack of housing on the North Coast is and how different the crisis is here compared to the I-5 corridor," Mitchell said in a release. "We will be tackling housing this session and I am going to

work towards housing solutions that work for the North Coast."

Mitchell plans to introduce legislation that would reduce caseloads in the state Department of Human Services' child services division. As part of her new position, Mitchell had to quit her job as a social worker with the department.

"As things are, child welfare has been rightfully tasked with extraordinarily high standards in caring for

Oregon's vulnerable kids, but with shrinking resources and larger, more complex caseloads," she said. "This is especially true in my district, where I saw the pressures firsthand.

"There are common-sense changes that we can make to improve child services, along with the partnership of leaders and front-line workers within DHS, so that the most vulnerable kids in our communities have a fair shot at leading a good life."

Woman killed in collision with jetty-rock trailer

LONG BEACH, Wash. — A woman died Friday in a traffic accident on U.S. Highway 101 in Pacific County, and a man was injured in a separate accident. Both involved semi-tractor trucks used for hauling rocks to the North Jetty reconstruction project, the Washington State Patrol said.

Vicky Johnson, 64, of Hoquiam, Washington, died

at about 10:10 a.m. Friday when her southbound 2015 Nissan Rogue collided with the second of two trailers being towed by a northbound 2000 Peterbilt tractor. The trailer crossed into the southbound lane into the path of the Nissan, according to a report by the state patrol.

The collision occurred about 4.5 miles north of Raymond. The highway was closed for four hours. The Peterbilt was

driven by Keith Leitz, 62, of Toledo. Leitz was not injured.

The cause of the accident is under investigation.

In an earlier accident at about 4:43 a.m. Friday, Joel Allen Brown, 58, of Prescott, Washington, was injured and taken to Willapa Harbor Hospital in South Bend after his southbound 1999 Peterbilt tractor with two trailers ran off Highway 101 18 miles south of South Bend.

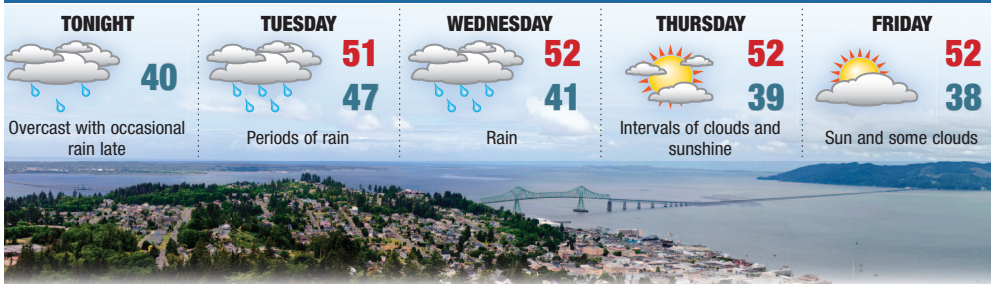

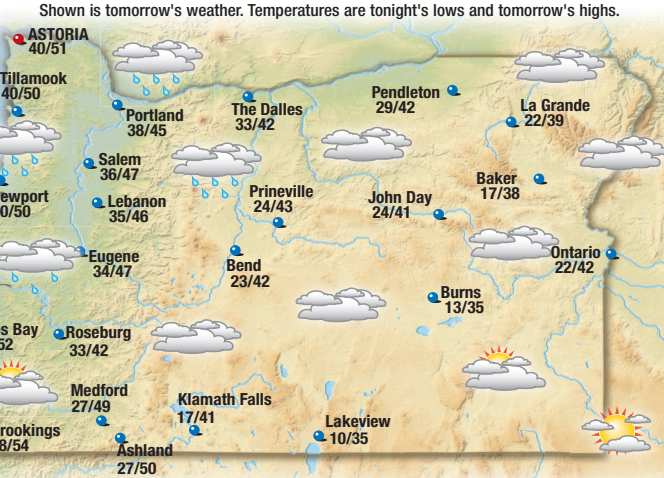

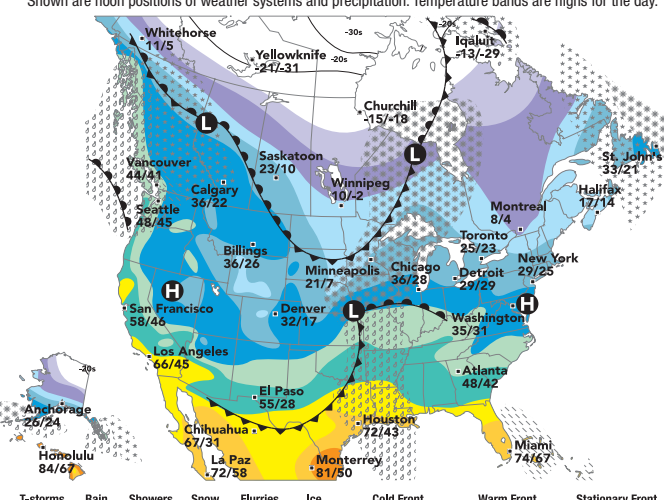
