



## **Gerald Conrad Phillips** Seaside

World War II veteran Gerald "Jerry" Conrad Phillips, 95, died Feb. 27, 2019. At his request, no service will be held. Jerry was born on June 20, 1923 in

Vancouver, Washington, the only child of Albert William Phillips

and Lucille Bayless Phillips.

In 1941, he graduated from Astoria High School, and soon after joined the Army Air Corps, becoming a B-26 Marauder aircraft navigator/bombardier with the 456th Bomb Squadron in the European Theater. He flew

43 bombing missions, including providing support to Gen. George Patton's entry into Germany towards the end of the war. He received an honorable discharge in 1945.

Jerry married his high school sweetheart, Betty Lynn Gosnell, and they shared 64 years together until her death. His three children survive him, Darby Young Gott (spouse Stanley), Jeryl Lynn McGee and Kevin William Phillips (spouse Molly.) Five grandchildren, Ryan and Philip Gott, Jodie McGee Fleming, Brett McGee and Emily Phillips Campeau, and six great-grandchildren, who called him "Papa," also survive him.

He had many careers in his lifetime,


We will miss Jeanette's bright smile, caring heart and her quick wit. She loved


