Astoria gets first win over Yamhill-Carlton

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Tied 2-2 through three innings, Astoria finally pulled away from Yamhill-Carlton in a nonleague softball game Tuesday, for a 6-2 win over the Tigers at CMH Field.

Both teams came in with 0-1 records.

Yamhill pitcher Kyli Nagode struck out 10 batters with no walks, but the Tiger defense struggled with six errors. The first five runs of the game were all unearned.

In the bottom of the second, Astoria’s Emma Biederman reached base on a dropped ball, third strike. An errant throw to first base also went past the right fielder for a second error, and Biederman ended up at third.

She scored moments later on a passed ball.

Halle Helmersen was hit by a pitch, and Tenley Matteucci also reached base on a dropped ball third strike, with another errant throw scoring Helmersen.

An Astoria error allowed two Tiger runs to score in the third.

The Fishermen scored the go-ahead run in the fourth, when Helmersen reached on another dropped ball third strike error on the Tigers.

Yamhill’s second error of the inning allowed Hailey O’Brien to reach on a bunt, scoring Helmersen.

Four of Astoria’s five hits came in the fifth and sixth innings. Jenna Barendse and Biederman both had singles in the fifth. Matteucci and O’Brien had base hits in the sixth, resulting in the final run.

Astoria pitcher Julia Norris did the rest, striking out 10 with two walks, and limiting the Tigers to two hits.

Warrenton won a low-scoring defensive battle Tuesday against Tillamook, in nonleague baseball action at Huddleston Field.

Both teams combined for eight hits — all singles — while Warrenton pitchers Dalton Knight and Devin Jackson tossed a three-hit shutout, with 10 strikeouts and

one walk. The two threw just 89 pitches, with Knight working six innings to pick up the win.

“It was a well-played, well-pitched game,” said Warrenton coach Lennie Wolfe, whose team improves to 2-1. “I felt like (the Cheesemakers) were doing things the right way, and Tyson Wilkes did a great job of locating and keeping us just off-balance enough at the plate. We had a good approach at the plate and made a lot of contact (Wilkes had four strikeouts), just not a lot of hits.”

That is, until the fourth inning, when Warrenton had three consecutive hits with two outs.

Gabe Breitmeyer had the first, stole second and scored on a single by Kale’o Kapua, who stole second and scored on a hit by Duane Falls.

Austin Little had Warrenton’s two other hits.

Italian foreign exchange student Ambrogio Biancofiore had one of Tillamook’s three hits.

Warrenton is scheduled to play a doubleheader Saturday at Monroe.

Seaside’s Hoekstre wins two events at invitational

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The Astoria and Seaside track teams officially opened the 2019 season last week in a big meet invitational in Portland, as Grant High School hosted the Cotton Invitational at its Marshall campus Friday.

The Astoria girls finished sixth out of 16 schools, with Seaside 11th. On the boys’ side, Astoria was 10th and Seaside 13th in the scoring.

Seaside senior Gretchen Hoekstre, who signed a letter-of-intent Monday to compete next year at Brigham Young University, won the shot put with a toss of 42 feet, 2 inches, and also won the discus with a personal best 144-2 ½.

Astoria’s Kes Sandstrom was third in the discus (115-3) and fifth in the shot put (31-4).

Some big finishes for the Lady Fishermen included Elizabeth Barnett (third in pole vault, 8-6, and third in triple jump, 31-5) and Kelsey Fausett (fifth in 400 meters, 1:04.66; sixth in javelin, 98-4).

In the boys’ meet, Astoria’s Ian Hunt had the fourth-best time in the 110-meter hurdles (17.02), and was fifth in the high jump (5-10). Teammate Presley Beck was third in the triple jump (38-1 ½).

Seaside’s Luke Nelson was fourth in the shot put (43-5), followed by teammate Derrick Bennett (fifth, 43-4) and Astoria’s Colton McMaster (sixth, 42-10 ½). Seaside’s Parker Conrad was fourth in the javelin (142-2).



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
