The first Christmas cards were published in London in 1845 by Henry Cole who hired artist John Hersley to create the cards. In 1849, Esther Howland published elaborately decorated Valentine's Day cards. Louis Prang revolutionized the card industry by introducing the lithographic process to produce ele-

gant Christmas cards in 1856. In the years since, many different kinds of cards have been created for nearly every occasion or occurrence.

Recently, the card industry has been changed by the development of e-cards. However, the latest trend is a return to hand-crafted cards as well as the mass produced cards.

The artists at the Astoria Art Loft have created/painted cards for all occasions. A special exhibit of the cards will be held on Friday, Oct. 11 and Saturday, Oct. 12 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.


