4-H provides young people with intentional, high quality learning experiences that promote positive interactions with adults and peers, sustained and active participation across time, and opportunities to make meaningful contributions to the world around them.

Positive Youth Development:

4-H is a volunteer based program where adults work with youth to teach them mastery in a project (such as how to take a good photograph), but it is more than that. We teach life skills such as responsibility, record keeping, giving to others, teamwork, and so much more. Currently we have youth on a waiting list to learn skills in a club setting for art and archery for the youth ages 9-19. We also have a lot of youth ages 5 to 8 that are in need of leaders to work with them in our Cloverbud program. This program does not focus on one project, but is intended give these young members many learning opportunities to encourage opening their mind to new learning. 4-H leaders are asked to have 2-deep leadership when leading a group, and training is available to help you prepare of your role. We would also like to offer more science education opportunities such as Lego Robotics and utilizing some of the other science resources available in our county.
