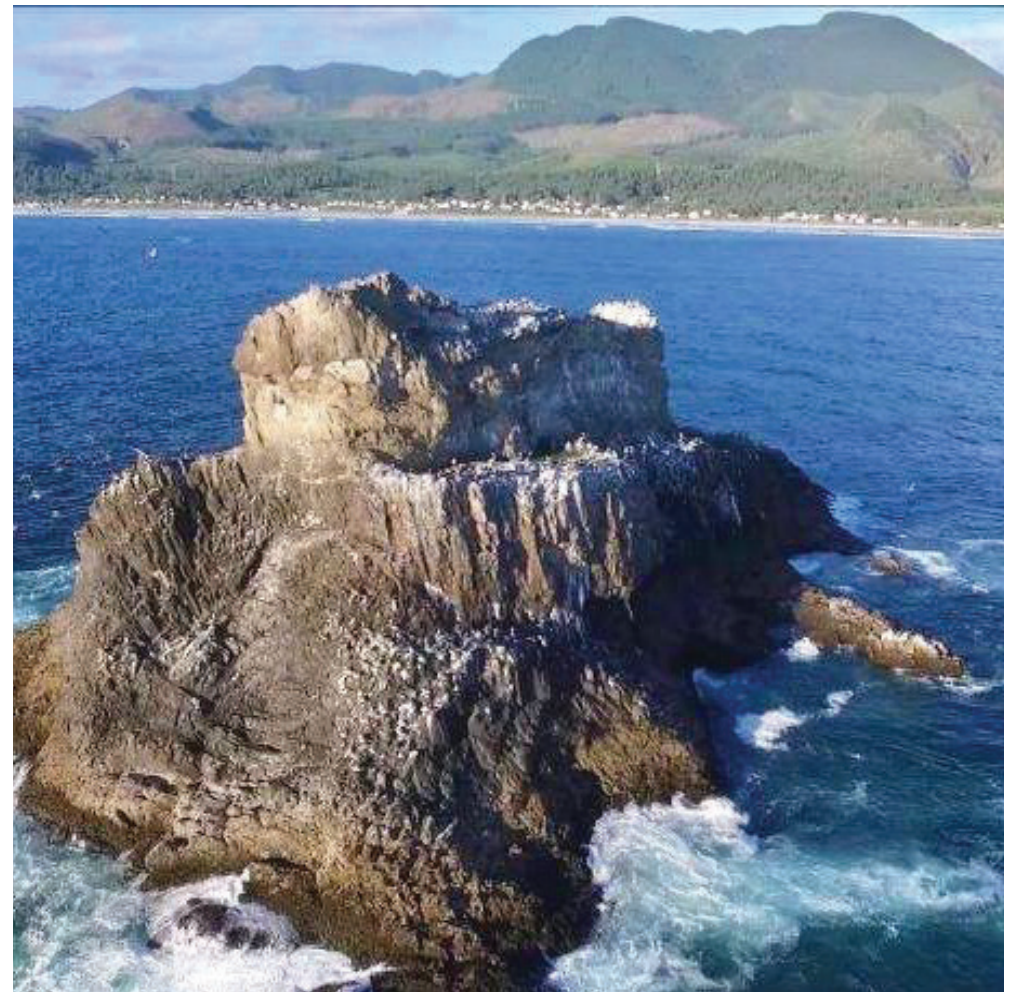
Pier Pressure seeks actors
