The final accolades of the season were recently handed out for class 2A Oregon football, with the release of the all-state squad.

Of the 88 positions on the 2A all-state football team, players from Knappa and Warrenton grabbed a combined 17 spots — 10 Loggers and seven Warriors.

The two Clatsop County schools dominated the 2A Northwest League in 2019, with the Loggers advancing to the semifinals,

while the Warriors made the quarterfinals.

Both teams were eliminated from the playoffs by eventual state champion Heppner.

First team selections included Knappa seniors Kanai Phillip (receiver and defensive back) and Jaxson Goodman (defensive line), and Warrenton junior Sam Irwin (offensive line).

Both teams had numerous second and third team selections, including Knappa senior Eli Takalo (second team quarterback) and Warrenton senior Kenzie Ramsey (third team place kicker).

Seaside holds off Corbett

After an 0-2 start to the season, the Seaside girls basketball team is looking more like a Cowapa League team, following their second straight win Thursday night.

The Lady Gulls had everything well in hand by halftime in a nonleague game at Corbett, leading 23-9 at the break on their way to a much-tougher-than-it-should-have-been 38-31 victory over the Cardinals.

After playing to a 7-7 tie in the first quarter, Seaside outscored Corbett 16-2 in the second in a foul-plagued first half, which featured a combined 25 fouls.

While the Cardinals finished 1-for-9 at the free throw line in the first half, the Gulls were dominating the boards and racking up points, including a pair of 3-pointers by Jadah Doney in the second period.

Lilli Taylor and Tristyn McFadden both knocked down 3-pointers in the third quarter for an eventual 29-14 lead.

That's when the Cardinals had their only good stretch of offense in the game, as Corbett answered with 3-pointers by Sydney

Schimel, Luciana Raimondo and Tia Kendall, trimming the Seaside lead to 29-25.

Taylor led the Gulls with nine points before fouling out, while Doney and Ruby Douglas had eight points apiece. Olivia Fritz had 10 points for Corbett before fouling out.

Ramsey tosses in 30 points as Warrenton tops Neah-Kah-Nie

WARRENTON — The Neah-Kah-Nie girls basketball team made its first mistake of the night by choosing not to guard Warrenton's Kenzie Ramsey very closely.

And the Warrior senior made the Pirates pay.

One of the most dangerous players in 3A girls basketball, Ramsey tied her school record with eight 3-pointers, on her way to a career-high 30 points to highlight Warrenton's 55-27 nonleague victory.

And the game wasn't nearly that close.

The Lady Warriors led just 12-8 late in the first quarter, but with two minutes left in the third period, Warrenton had pushed the lead to 46-9.

The 34-1 run was highlighted by Ramsey.

In addition to scoring on a few fast breaks, Warrenton's hot-shooting guard found herself open for numerous 3-pointers.

And she hit from all distances, including two 3-pointers in the first quarter, two more in the second and three treys in the third, with her seventh 3-pointer giving the Warriors their 46-9 lead.

Sophomore Emma Miller led Neah-Kah-Nie with 16 points, while Avyree Miethe added 13 points for Warrenton.
