ASTORIA — April's Second Saturday Art Walk will be held virtually Saturday.

In response to Oregon's non-essential business closures, the Astoria Downtown Historic District Association will post video footage of participating galleries to the association's Facebook page and website.

Participating galleries include AVA Center for the Arts, Bridge & Tunnel Bottleshop & Taproom, Imogen Gallery, KALA, Old Town Framing, Paul Polson Studio Gallery, River-Sea Gallery, Tempo Gallery and West Coast Artisans.

Below is an overview of some of the artists who will be featured.

AVA Center for the Arts

AVA resident artists Denise Monaghan and Karen Ni Neill Bear's works will be featured. Monaghan will include portraits and animal paintings. Ni Neill Bear will showcase large oil paintings of the female figure.

The center also is featuring an exhibit which honors the artists who represent AVA Center for the Arts, help enrich the community and contribute to Astoria's art scene.

Imogen Gallery

Internationally-recognized artist April Coppini's exhibit, "Inescapable Gaze," will be featured. Coppini typically uses charcoal as her chosen medium. Her drawings, which showcase animals, ask viewers to consider the role humans do or do not take in protecting the relationship between humans and animals.

Paul Polson Studio Gallery

Featuring a variety of oil paintings and

water-based works. Polson also showcases inflatable works monthly.

RiverSea Gallery

Presenting "A Modern View," a collection of deconstructed still-life and landscape paintings by Seattle artist Brooke Borcharding. Cannon Beach-based jeweler Lisa Kerr introduces her new "Sotto Mare" series, inspired by sunken treasures.

Tempo Gallery

Featuring fine arts photographer Carol Smith's works. Smith's pieces include scenic portraits of local sights such as Astoria's waterfront and local mountains.

West Coast Artisans

Showcasing several local artists, such as painter Michael Muldoon and mixed-media artist Kitty Paino. Muldoon's works feature oil paintings. Both Muldoon and Paino have pieces that showcase local sights, such as Youngs Bay.
