Where to stream locally-filmed movies

While the North Coast is known for being home to movies like “The Goonies,” “Kindergarten Cop” and “The Ring,” there are many more films that feature local coastal towns. Here is a look at some locally-filmed movies available to stream at home.

“The Great Race” (1965) — Characters Leslie and Professor Fate race from New York to Paris. Filming locations include Gearhart, California and Austria. Stream the film on Amazon Prime, Google Play, iTunes, YouTube and Vudu.

“1941” (1979) — Starring John Belushi and Dan Aykroyd, a group of Californians prepare for an invasion from Japan, days after Pearl Harbor. Filming locations include Cannon Beach, Gold Beach and California. Stream the film on Amazon Prime, Crackle, Google Play, iTunes, YouTube and Vudu.

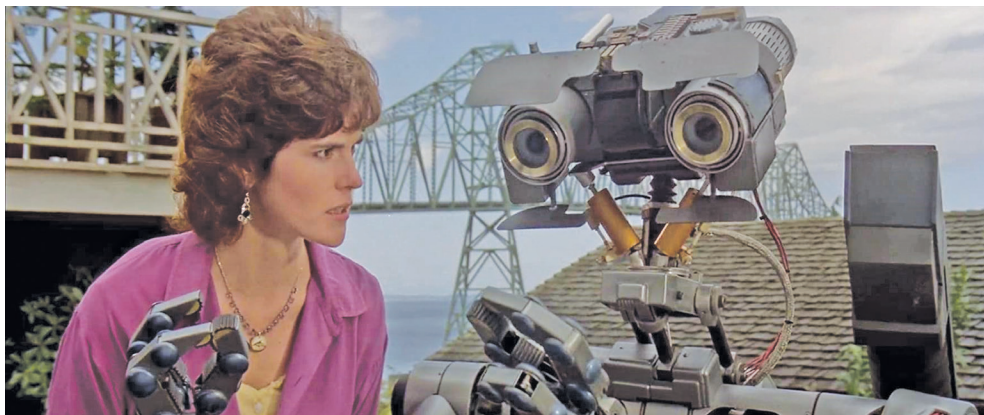

“Come See the Paradise” (1990) — A couple faces the struggle of maintaining their relationship after one of the two is placed into a Japanese internment camp. “Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles III” (1993) — The turtles go back in time in Japan. Astoria was used as a filming location. Stream the film on Google Play, iTunes, YouTube and Vudu.

“The Ring” (2002) — A reporter investigates a mysterious video that has led to multiple deaths. Filming locations include Astoria,

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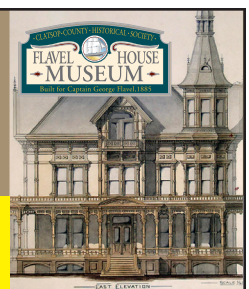
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
