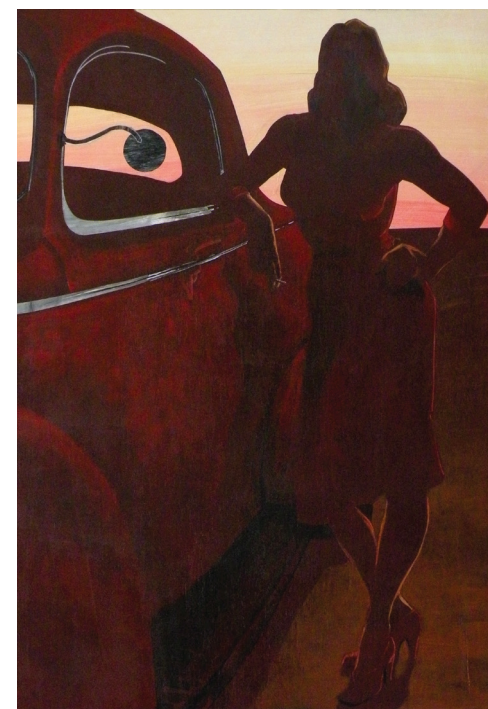
5. Imogen Gallery, 240 11th St.
