Herbert Kaul, 86, passed away peacefully at Clatsop Care Memory Community in Warrenton, Oregon, on June 2, 2020.

Herbert was born Oct. 28, 1933, in Highmore, South Dakota, to parents Julius Kaul and Ida Wieser. He grew up on a farm in Scotland, South Dakota, with his four brothers, Edwin, Ervin, Robert and Clifford, and one sister, Irene.

In 1952, after graduating from Scotland High School, Herb joined the Navy, where he spent four years. He served on the USS Kearsarge, an aircraft carrier stationed in Guam, as well as at Tongue Point in Astoria, Oregon. He received a National Defense Service Medal and a Good Conduct Medal.

After the Navy, Herb spent 29 years as a logger with Crown Zellerbach starting in 1956 alongside his brothers, Ervin and Robert. He also worked for Hopkes Logging in Tillamook, Oregon, and Longview Fiber in Clatskanie, Oregon, where he retired in 1995.

Herbie married Annie Gronnel on May 23, 1963, and they lived in Astoria, Oregon. Annie Kaul had a son, Bill Larremore. Then Herbie and Annie had a daughter, Kimberlee Kaul.

Herbie and Annie were happily married for 49 years. Annie passed on Oct. 21,

2013. Bill passed on May 23, 2014.

Herbie is survived by his daughter, Kimberlee Kaul, of Astoria, Oregon, and her partner, Donnie Reaves, from Anniston, Alabama, who became Herbie's best friend in his last years. Herbie gained a granddaughter, Megan Reaves Gattis, from Kilgore, Texas; these two truly enjoyed being around each other. Megan always kept Herbie smiling, laughing and even dancing.

Herb always enjoyed spending time with his family, clam digging, fishing, hunting, tinkering, chopping

LeRoy, or "Ming the Merciless," if you were in the know, was a true gentleman, legend and iconic champion of Astoria. He was a fixture and fierce advocate for the Uniontown neighborhood and Suomi Hall. LeRoy was a renaissance man, his eye never missing a detail, and his skills were as vast as the circle of friends that were his world.

LeRoy always lived his best life and filled it with adventure, community and his love for gardening, Asian culture, his Finnish heritage and sense of harmony. His mark on this town is huge.

He and his life companion, David Drafall, maintained a business, One Six Five West Bond, the Doughboy Monument, worked at building up the Uniontown image and spearheaded the continued presence of Suomi Hall, with respect for our strong Finnish connection in Astoria.

LeRoy was a classy man, and one arena where he stood tall and proud was as a gay man in Astoria. LeRoy was the first out and visible gay man in Astoria, who many of us felt honored to know and befriend. He calmly helped others to be comfortable as their true selves, and helped to integrate gay people through socializing with every strata of culture here.

Famous for his Astoria Regatta and other parties, he was a gracious and inclusive host. LeRoy had a keen interest in progressive politics, civil rights and scintillating conversations with diverse people here, and around the world. This attitude was likely inspired by his politically active grandmother, Emilia Peuhkurinen-Bohm, who lived with him in the family home.

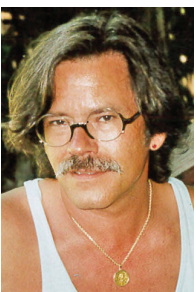
Then there were LeRoy's significant passions for gardening, bonsai and fine art. His aesthetic for balance and flow in the garden inspired many to step up their garden game. He led through example, his life a rich and beautiful tapestry of true presence.

If one walked into a room with LeRoy present, he was always honored if you greeted him first. If one needed to know how to prune a maple, how to address a situation or make a change, LeRoy was the one we went to first. He never forgot you, and we will never forget him.

this project completed around the end of September, with an early October Grand Opening Ceremony," Garrigues said.

"Our next steps are to finish the exterior shell, groundwork, frame interior walls, continued work on electrical, plumbing, and HVAC, drywall and interior finishes, painting and finally finish up with outfitting by hanging nets," decorated with Seagull Pride.

They will also be, "setting up accessories and equipment such as pricing machines, screens, batting mats and portable mounds."

She added, "It has truly been incredible to see all the local contractors and businesses coming together to help make this project a reality. We have had donated time and materials from local plumbers, electricians, rental companies, building contractors, material suppliers, excavators, concrete and HVAC technicians."

In addition to coaching different sports at the youth and high school levels, Chris Corder "has been the leader of this project, and has spent incalculable hours on this project," Garrigues said.

"From project management, acquiring donated materials and services, and incredible communication on updates on the project, he has been an absolute rockstar."

Also involved are three Seaside Class of 2021 seniors who are volunteering their time on the project for their Pacifica projects.

Kandice Flaigg, Jared White and Cash Corder have been participating through fundraising and organization to digging ditches and installing materials onsite.

"They will be assisting us throughout the project, and it's been a great experience for them to be a part of the project," Garrigues said.

Local businesses and contractors that have helped with the project will be honored on a donor board at the indoor facility, along with other donors who have sent in monetary donations.

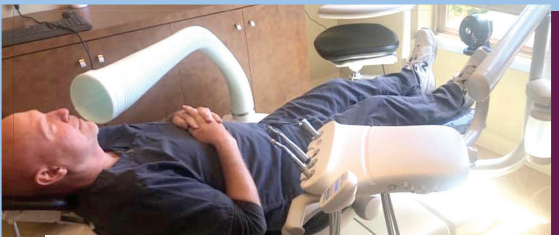

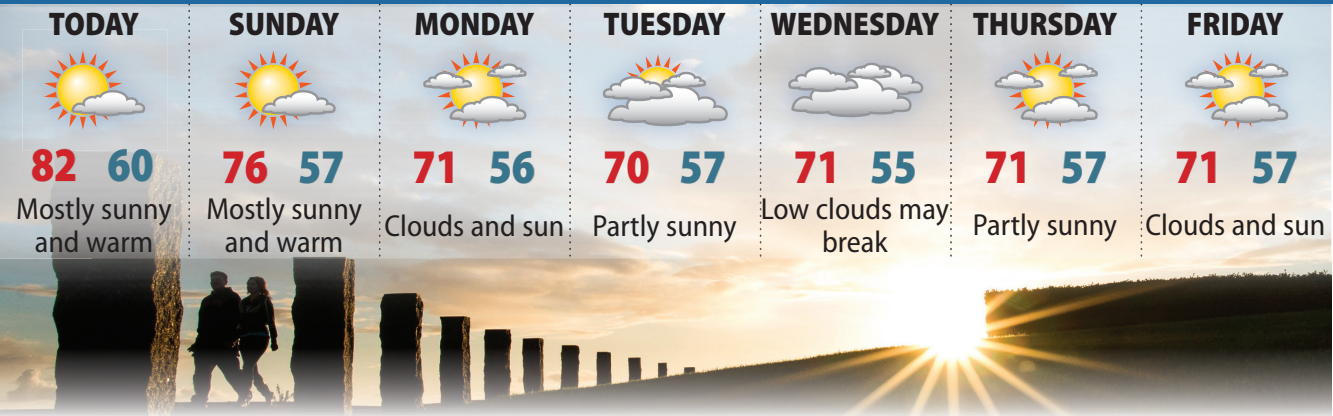
