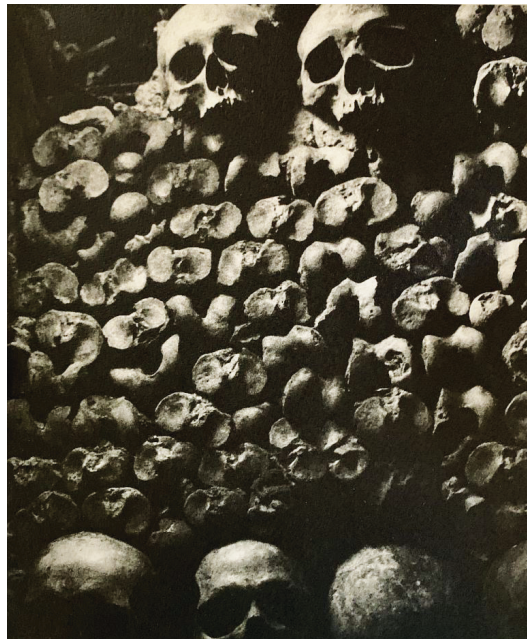


‘The Spooky Show’ returns

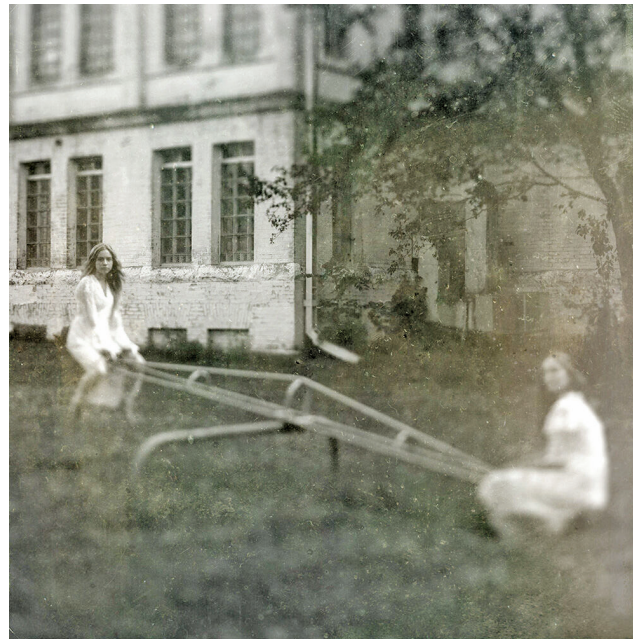
ASTORIA — LightBox Photographic Gallery will open its original show, “The Spooky Show,” from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday.
