Rosann Knight Mayes passed away Oct. 9, 2020, in the early morning hours, at Rock of Ages Valley View Retirement Village memory care in McMinnville, where she had been a resident for five years. She was 84 years old.

Rosann was born April 13, 1936, in Portland, to Cyrus and Ellah (Moore) Knight. When Rosann was a young child her family moved to Celilo Falls, where her father opened and closed the ship passage locks on the Columbia River.

At the start of World War II, the family moved to Tigard, and her father became employed as a ship builder during the war, and later started his own business. Rosann attended Charles F. Tigard Grammar School, and graduated from Tigard High School in 1954. Rosann enjoyed and idyllic life in Tigard with her family.

Following high school graduation, Rosann married Joseph Dollar, and they had four children, Wayne, Carolyn, Barbara and Daniel.

Rosann was a loving mother to her children, and busy with homemaking skills of canning, cooking, baking, sewing and various other crafts that utilized her artistic flair and attention to detail. She was an exquisite and sought-after cake decorator, and enjoyed making spectacular wedding cakes and birthday cakes for family and friends.

In 1969, Rosann married Douglas West, and they had one child, Dianna. The family soon became a military family, and the military life became the norm as the family traveled to Colorado, Germany and Texas before returning back to Oregon.

Upon returning to the Tigard area, Rosann worked many years as a dry-cleaning professional and retired from the profession in 1987. Her attention to detail made her one of the best, as any garment she worked with was returned to the customer not just cleaned, but perfected.

Following her retirement, Rosann married Jack Mayes and moved to The Colony, Texas, where they resided for many years. Following the death of her husband, Rosann

returned again to her beloved Oregon, and settled in Astoria, where she enjoyed the beauty of the North Coast and the comfort of family and friends.

She had a beautiful home, and loved to decorate and entertain, especially for the holidays. She also loved to travel and visited many national parks, with Denali National Park & Preserve in Alaska being her greatest adventure.

Rosann had a very giving nature, was always cheerful and had a ready smile, along with a deep and abiding faith.

In 2013 she moved to Rock of Ages Valley View Retirement Village in McMinnville. She enjoyed the fun activities and fellowship offered. In 2015, she moved into Rock of Ages memory care. The family is grateful to the staff of Rock of Ages for their compassionate, kind and faith-based care.

She is survived by her five children, Wayne (Pat) Dollar, of Kennewick, Washington, Carolyn (Calvin) Smithrud, of McMinnville, Barbara (Mark) Acuna, of Astoria, Daniel Dollar, of Kenai, Alaska, and Dianna (Dave) Fox, of Benton City, Washington.

She is also survived by six grandchildren, Kimberly (Erik) Johnson, Christy Acuna, Matthew (Natalie) Acuna, Jared (Heather) Acuna, Elizabeth Laster and Luke Fox; and four great-grandchildren, Samantha and Billy Laster and Sofia and Logan Johnson. Rosann also is survived by many loved nieces and nephews and cousins.

Rosann has impacted many lives, and will be deeply missed. She is interred at Forest View Cemetery in Forest Grove alongside her parents and near to her beloved brother, George.

Dorothy Walker Tienison Johnson

Astoria

May 27, 1923 — Oct. 6, 2020

Dorothy Walker Tienison Johnson died peacefully on Oct. 6, 2020, in Astoria, at the age of 97.

She was born Dorothy Ann Walker on May 27, 1923, in Astoria, to Dr. Donald and Sadie (Swanson) Walker. Dr. Walker was a prominent dentist and concert pianist, and Dorothy's early childhood revolved around family activities, especially music and song.

Tragedy struck in 1932, when Dr. Walker contracted brain cancer and died. The ensuing years of the Great Depression were challenging, but her interest in music continued.

She graduated from Astoria High School in 1941, and then attended Oregon State University as a music major for a year, touring the local region as a singer in a choral group and later at the Astoria USO, where she volunteered to help entertain soldiers and sailors stationed nearby.

In January 1946, she married her long-time sweetheart, John Tienison, who died in 1984. Their first child, Thane, was born later in 1946, followed by three more boys, John, David and Donald. Dorothy's husband was a pilot during World War II and the Korean War. He considered a career in the U.S. Air Force before becoming an air traffic controller in 1957.

Dorothy and her family then relocated to the San Francisco Bay Area, first to Oakland and then to Fremont. Dorothy went to work for Alameda County in its public works department. She retired from the county in 1976, and returned to Astoria to care of her mother, and she finally learned how to drive. She volunteered at Columbia Memo-

rial Hospital and Peace Lutheran Church, and was a member of the North Coast Chorale. She enjoyed hiking and joined the local chapter of Mazamas.

In 1998, she married Clyde Johnson. The couple bought a small home overlooking the Columbia River and traveled in Clyde's motor home. They spent 10 very happy years together before Clyde's death in 2008.

Until her health began to fail, Dorothy continued to volunteer, visit with family and longtime pals, play bridge and scrabble, read mysteries and stay up late and watch favorite old movies.

Dorothy will always be remembered for her warm heart, her love for all living creatures, her ready smile and laugh and her generous spirit.

She is survived by her sons, Thane Tienison, of Portland, and John Tienison, of Eddyville; her grandchildren, Erik Tienison, of Hood River, Julia Tienison, of Portland, and Linnea Baker and Breanna Tienison, both of Willows, California; and several great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her first husband, John Tienison; and their sons, David and Donald; and her second husband, Clyde Johnson.

Lorraine Adelle Andriesian, 88, passed away May 23, 2020.

Lorraine was a child of God, and the only child born to Wallace G. Robertson and Pauline Ruth (Shoun) Robertson on June 3, 1931, in Roseburg.

She graduated from Cottage Grove High School in 1949, and soon after high school she married the handsome man of her dreams, Daniel Richard Andriesian. They were married for life until Dan's death in 2008. Dan had just turned 80 the day before his death.

Dan and Lorraine started their family of three children while Dan was in dental school (Oregon Health and Science University Class of 1957). They moved to Cottage Grove, where he started his dental practice.

Lorraine wore many hats in her beautiful life; she was a homemaker, dental assistant, artist, floral arranger, pianist, singer, farm hand, photographic colorist, loving wife and mother to Mike Andriesian, Rick Andriesian and Paula St James.

In 1969, the family moved to Warrenton, where Lorraine was also the dental office manager and first mate to Capt. Dan on their charter boat, the Paradox, which they lived aboard for 15 years.

Lorraine was also active in her community, and left her mark as a member of the Red Hat Society, Beta Sigma Phi Sorority, the garden club and sang with Seaside's Sweet Adelines Sandpipers chorus for years. Lorraine organized the Miss Clatsop County Scholar-

ship Pageant for a couple of years, and was a life member of the Warrenton First Baptist Church.

Lorraine is survived by her three children, Michael Andriesian, and his wife, Valerie Nuzum, of Vancouver, Washington, Rick Andriesian, and his wife, Deni, of Sandy, and Paula St. James, of Boise, Idaho; six grand grandchildren, Paula's son, Eric Holm, Rick's sons, Derek and Aram Andriesian, and Mike's children, Nik Arnold and Cora Arnold; and great-grandchildren, Derek and Keyla's children, Penelope and Olivia (new-born) of Los Angeles, California.

She was preceded in death by a grandchild, Mingo Shay Arnold.

Lori had been living in an assisted living home for several years in Sandy and died after an unexpected health crisis ended her life. She passed at Rick and Deni's home, surrounded by family.

Friends and relatives are invited to attend her memorial service, scheduled for Oct. 24 at 11 a.m. at the Warrenton First Baptist Church.

County reports new virus cases

Clatsop County reported three new coronavirus cases this week.

The county reported Thursday that two people living in the northern part of the county have tested positive. A woman in her 40s and a boy between 10 and 19 years old were reportedly recovering at home.

On Tuesday, the county reported that a man in his 60s living in the northern part of the county tested pos-

itive and was reportedly recovering at home.

Clatsop County has recorded 234 cases since March. Two-hundred and twenty-one have recovered, according to the county, and the others were convalescing at home.

The Oregon Health Authority reported 38,935 cases and 617 deaths from the virus statewide as of Friday morning.

The health authority tracked 6,574 test results in Clatsop County.

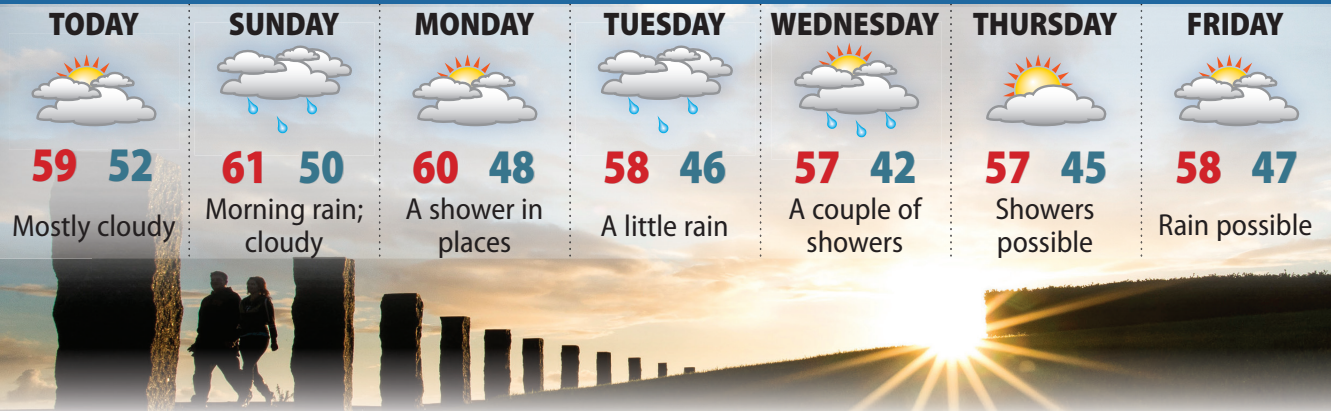
