




Thane Tienson

hane Tienson was a proud native of Astoria, an avid runner, and an unabashed liberal fighting for environmental and human rights as an attorney who was still a practicing lawyer with the firm Landye Bennett Blumstein. Thane's family moved away from Astoria to the Bay Area when he was a boy. He attended Santa Clara University in California before serving in the Vietnam War, where he earned two Purple Hearts for injuries sustained in battle. After serving in the military, he attended Lewis & Clark College in Portland, becoming a lawyer in 1977. A devoted community servant, Thane served on the boards of a multitude of civic organizations, including the Friends of Astoria Column. He is survived by his brother, John; son, Erik; daughter, Julia; and grandson, Gavin. He was preceded in death by his mother, Dorothy; father, John; and brothers, David and Donald.
