Museum exhibit reflects on boarding schools

ASTORIA — Clatsop County Historical Society is hosting a temporary exhibit until May 25 at the Heritage Museum, 1618 Exchange St.

The exhibit, "Away from Home: American Indian Boarding School Stories,"

explores off-reservation boarding schools that the U.S. government used between the 1870s and 1930s to educate and assimilate American Indians.

Admission costs \$5 per person. The museum is open daily from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
