Seaside overcame an early 2-1 deficit to defeat Astoria for the second time in 10 days, as the Gulls finished off the Fishermen in six innings, 13-2, in a Cowapa League baseball game on Friday at CMH Field.

The Gulls picked up all they would need with a fiverun third inning, highlighted by a run-scoring double from Ryan Varoza that scored Luke Toyooka, and a pair of RBI singles.

Seaside scored twice on wild pitches to build a 7-2 lead through three innings.

Toyooka added a leadoff triple in the fifth, in which Kaleb Bartel had a two-run single for the Gulls, who collected nine hits off three Astoria pitchers.

Seaside pitchers Tanner Kraushaar, Andrew Teubner and Cash Corder allowed just two hits, with six walks and six strikeouts.
