Japanese tradition, globalized western consumerism and his life in the U.S. Brig's work includes 3D mixed media collages.

9. Imogen Gallery, 240 11th St.

Featuring creations by Deb Stoner, who is a photographer, researcher and gardener. Stoner's photographs are detailed and weave texture and color. Her prints are inspired by her passions for growing plants, collecting insects and choreographing still-life images. Stoner's work will be displayed until June 7.

10. Forsythea, 1124 Commercial St.

Featuring paintings by Monica Cameron in the show "Begin Again." The show is a compilation of works that "reflect on earthly renewal and the gentle creatures that inhabit it."

11. RiverSea Gallery, 1160 Commercial St.

Featuring paintings by Kate Speranza, whose work is a "visual survey of the unintentional." Speranza's work features scuffs, scrapes, splatters and spills, which she uses to relate to the history of humans marking personal spaces. Work by Lucca Ettienne, which "creates anthropomorphic artwork referencing cultural and cosmic influences," is also featured. Ettienne's pieces include charcoal and mixed media on raw-edged canvas.

12. Oscar de' Masi Art Gallery, 1145 Commercial St.

Featuring new paintings, prints, art tiles, mugs and wooden boxes by local artist Oscar de' Masi; locally-sourced, handcrafted furniture by Michael Demasi; and water-color paintings by Karl Hauer.

14. Munktiki, 1241 Duane St.

Featuring mugs and a variety of artists' works. Munktiki will be celebrating its reopening.

15. Cambium Gallery, 1030 Duane St.

Featuring artist Erika Rier for a solo show titled "Before & During." New work by owners Kirista Trask and Audrey Long will also be featured.

16. Astoria Visual Arts, 1000 Duane St.

Featuring Clatsop County high school students' art in the gallery's annual high school art show. Student artists from Astoria, Knappa and Warrenton are featured. The show is part of the gallery's Miss Bea Johnson Fund, which supports community-based arts learning for teenagers.

17. Labor Temple Diner & Bar, 934 Duane St.

Featuring urbanscape painter J. Wesley Willis, whose oil paintings showcase Astoria's scenery. The show includes several new pieces.

13. Lumen: Community Wellness, 1350 Exchange St.

Featuring work by Katie Winters, whose work "captures details of life in the dream-like world she creates through her lens." Winters' work features mothers and the female form.
