General Fund anticipated resources for this fiscal year are \$2,568,201 from various sources. While revenue is increasing, municipal tax rate remains at 1.0053 per thousand. The 3.9% conservative increase of city tax revenue is appropriate due to the amount of new development in 2020/2021 and increase the per tribusian. The 3-39 conservative increase in trig, rac Fevenue is appropriate due to the amount on the development in 2020/2021 and interest operity values. Another source of revenue is the Transient Room Tax (TRT), which is anticipated to be \$380,000, and is a \$130,000 increase over last year's udgeted amount. Room taxes from hotels and vacation rentals are expected to be similar to this year because of the COVID-19 pandemic and pent-up dem or travel. Last year the TRT was underestimated not anticipating COVID would increase travel to Gearhart. A future drop in building permit fees may be in the ture as available buildable land in Gearhart is reduced because our available buildable lands are in decline. Included in the budget are the approp necessary to implement the City's personnel costs. A Cost Of Living Adjustment (COLA) increase of 1.3% per the Social Security Administration is applied to alaries this year, beginning January 1st, 2022. Gearhart Reserve funds will again receive additional resources this year. The proposed State Revenue Sharing und expenditures will be finalized after citizen input at the public hearing. This year's budget is unique in that the City of Gearhart may receive \$330,000 from he American Rescue Plan approved by Congress. Research indicates that these funds may be used for infrastructure, planning, and emergency respo
