Oglesby and Pass, while the Loggers had a pair of three's from Brandon Gale. The two teams were a combined 10-for-38 on 3-pointers (Knappa 6-of-27, Salem Academy 4-for-11).

Salem Academy also clamped down defensively on Knappa junior Logan Morrill, who finished with two points.

Knappa coach Paul Isom said the Loggers "ran into a buzz saw. Salem Academy was really good, and their zone gave us problems the whole game.

"Offensively they were just so disciplined and didn't make any mistakes," he said. "Like usual, our guys played hard and had great energy.

We just couldn't get any easy buckets and our outside shots weren't falling. But there is no shame in losing to that team, and we still have a chance to play on Saturday, which is always the goal."


