Cultural Coalition offers grants to nonprofits

Coronavirus Relief Fund Cultural Support grant awards totaling \$25.7 million will be distributed to 621 cultural organizations across Oregon through a partnership between the Oregon Cultural Trust and its county and tribal cultural coalitions.

The grant awards are distributed to projects that support, maintain, preserve and protect cultural programs in the arts, heritage and humanities in Clatsop County. Organizations with 501(c)(3) nonprofit status are eligible to apply; individuals may apply when sponsored by a nonprofit fiscal agent.

Grant awards will be announced in December for activities occurring between Jan. 1 and Dec. 31, 2022. Grant funds are available up to \$2,000 per project. Approximately \$10,000 is awarded each grant cycle.
