Seaside boys cruise to Dulcich tourney wins

The Seaside boys basketball team — facing two Cowapa League foes — gave a short preview of how league play will go this season, as the Gulls defeated Astoria 75-50 in a Clatsop Clash game to finish the two-day Vince Dulcich Memorial tournament at the Brick House.

With only one other Cowapa team (Banks, at 13th) in the top 20 statewide, the No. 2-ranked Gulls are big favorites to run the table in league play this season, as they posted a 67-46 win over Tillamook to open the tournament Thursday, then followed with a victory over the Fishermen.

With Ever Sibony back in the lineup, the Gulls were back at full strength and hitting on all cylinders in Friday's win over Astoria.

Seaside made 11 3-pointers, including a pair by Cash Corder early in the second quarter, after Conner Langmo had two treys in the first period.

Astoria's Judd Field and Owen Williams drained 3-pointers in the second quarter, and had the Fishermen within 38-29 at halftime.

But a quick 13-4 run by Seaside to start the second half, highlighted by 3-pointers from Carson Kawasoe and Sibony, had the Gulls in control, 51-33.

Kawasoe added two more treys in the fourth quarter, with another by Izzy Jantes during an 11-0 run.

Seaside will prepare for a big showdown Friday at Knappa. The Loggers cruised to two victories in the Toledo Tournament Friday and Saturday, with wins over Waldport (61-48) and host Toledo (64-36).

In their first game of the tournament, the Astoria boys led from start to finish in a decisive 61-37 win over Gladstone.

Colton McMaster scored 10 of his game-high 19 points in the first quarter, while a 3-pointer from Niko Boudreau gave Astoria an early 12-2 lead.

A layup by Connelly Fromwiller off a steal made it 25-8, and the Fishermen finished with three players in double figures, as Judd Field added 16 and Boudreau scored 15.

No. 2-ranked Gladstone tops Astoria girls

In the final girls basketball game of the Vince Dulcich Memorial Tournament, second-ranked Gladstone defeated short-handed Astoria 48-24 Friday afternoon at the Brick House.

Two scores from Kaylee Falleur had the Lady Fishermen holding an early 9-3 lead, but the Gladiators closed the first half with a 17-5 run.

Gladstone's Sam Jedrykowski hit a 3-pointer to spark a 14-4 start to the second half, and the Gladiators outscored Astoria 14-5 in the fourth.

The Lady Fishermen were missing two starters, but even at 4-6 overall, Astoria is still 12th in the latest Oregon School Activities Association rankings.

The Lady Fishermen have home games this week vs. Scappoose and Milwaukie, followed by a Saturday game at Clatskanie.

Pirates 28, Gulls 26

The Gulls held another opponent under 30 points,

but the Gulls had scoring troubles of their own Friday morning on Day 2 of the Dulcich tournament.

Tied 18-18 after three quarters, Marshfield outscored Seaside 10-8 in the fourth for a 28-26 victory over the Gulls.

Seaside held a 24-21 lead following a basket by Aubrie Taylor, but Marshfield responded with two made free throws and scores from Alie Clarke and Charlie Dea for a 27-24 lead with under a minute remaining.

Seaside's Madi Olson scored with seven seconds left to bring the Gulls within 27-26, but the Pirates made a free throw with five seconds remaining for the final point.

Astoria 39, Marshfield 31

Astoria bounced back from a Wednesday loss to Mazama with an easy victory Thursday night over Marshfield, 39-31.

The Lady Fishermen trailed 14-11 in the second quarter, but outscored the Pirates 6-0 to close out the

first half, and never trailed again.

Mollie Matthews returned to the starting lineup, hit two 3-pointers in the first half, and scored seven points in the fourth quarter.

Kelso 57, Seaside 25

Kelso's Natalie Fraley — headed for Utah State — scored 22 points to lead the Hilanders past Seaside, 57-25, in an opening round game of the Dulcich tournament Thursday.

Fraley helped Kelso build a 30-16 halftime lead, and the Hilanders outscored the Gulls 27-9 in the second half.

Lilli Taylor scored 13 to lead Seaside. Lexi Grumbois added 12 for Kelso, a 3A Washington school.

Mazama 43, Warrenton 15

Warrenton finished the Dulcich tournament early Friday morning with a loss, as Mazama scored the first 17 points of the game on its way to a 43-15 win over the Warriors.

With a victory Wednes-

day night over Astoria, the Vikings went 2-1 in their three games at the Brick House.

The Warriors opened the tournament Thursday morning against Tillamook, with the Lady Mooks escaping with a 45-43 win.

Walter Vernon Palmrose

Seaside

March 13, 1934 — Dec. 28, 2021

A lifetime North Coast resident, Walter "Wally" Vernon Palmrose, 87, of Seaside, where he had been a resident for the last couple of years, died on Dec. 28, 2021.

Wally was born in Astoria, and was the son of Walter and Verna Palmrose of Knappa. He graduated from Knappa High School.

On Sept. 24, 1954, in Knappa, he married Mary E. Makela.

Wally was an Oregon National Guardsman, a member of the Astoria Assembly of God Church and a John Day Diking District board member.

Wally enjoyed hunting, camping, farming and spending time with family and friends.

Wally became a journeyman auto body and fender mechanic after serving an apprenticeship with Johnson Motors in 1965.

In 1968, in the John Day area of Astoria, he started Wally's Auto Repair business in conjunction with owning a Mobil service station. He later became a shareholder of the Astoria Plywood Corp.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by four sons, Vernon, Alan, of Astoria, David, of Aloha, and Leroy, of Seaside; two sisters, Florence Peugh, of Svensen, and Hazel Barendse, of Wilsonville; one brother, Robert Palmrose, of Salem; five grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be announced in the future.
