NW Natural customers to receive credits

ASTORIA — NW Natural customers were set to receive a credit on their bills in January, February and March to reduce energy costs during the winter months.

The credits, totaling more than \$40 million, are a result of NW Natural's pipeline capacity management and use of the company's underground natural gas storage facility.

The average residential customer can expect a credit of nearly \$13 a month, which is approximately a 13% savings on their average bill for the months of January, February and March.

The average small commercial customer can expect a credit of about \$60 a month, according to the company, which is an estimated 16% savings per month over that same time period.

This is the 19th year NW Natural has credited customers.

TLC shares 2021 community impact

TLC, a division of Fibre Federal Credit Union, serves 11 counties in Oregon and Washington with financial services and various community support projects.
