ASTORIA — Lewis and Clark National Historical Park is now recruiting participants for the 2022 Youth Conservation Corps, a program that allows youth ages 15 to 19 to work, learn, explore and serve in a scenic national

park from mid-June to mid-August.

The 10 week paid program features outdoor experience and learning opportunities in natural resource conservation, interpretive programs, trail maintenance and administration, including lead and crew positions.

Its mission is to help youth develop an appreciation for the nation's national parks while acquiring leadership skills, workplace ethics and a deeper understanding of conservation issues

Corps members will also participate in camping and other recreational activities, as well as learn about career paths in the National Park Service and other land management agencies.

Participants from all backgrounds are encouraged to apply. No previous wilderness experience is required.
