Voters urged to mail ballots early for May election

Voters who plan to mail their ballots for the May 17 election are encouraged to do so early to ensure the ballots are counted.

Mailed ballots must now be postmarked by Election Day. But there is no guarantee that ballots dropped into a mailbox after the box's final pickup time on May 17 will be postmarked that day, Clatsop County said in a statement.

Oregon changed the law to help ensure ballots postmarked on Election Day and received by county clerks within seven days would be counted.

Voters can also drop ballots off at several drop boxes by 8 p.m. on Election Day. The drop boxes are located outside the county office at Ninth and Exchange streets in Astoria, at Warrenton, Gearhart, Seaside and Cannon Beach city halls, at Knappa High School and Jewell School.

Voters must be registered by April 26. The county plans to start mailing out ballots on April 27.

The county clerk's office plans to livestream the ballot-counting process. This will include the verification of ballot signatures starting roughly May 2 and the counting of ballots starting on May 13. — The Astorian








