It's **bioluminescence** (by-oh-loo-muh-NEHS-sense) which means the making of light by living creatures.

Angler Fish

This deep-sea creature fishes for food. It has a long, skinny fin on top of its head that works like a fishing rod. A little bulb filled with glowing bioluminescent bacteria sits at the end of the rod.

When it wants to eat, the angler fish dangles the glowing bait in front of its mouth. A curious fish swims up for a closer look and—snap! the angler fish's

huge jaws snatch it up!



With the Flow

Sometimes, on dark nights, the waves of the ocean appear to glow. This is caused by tiny creatures called **dinoflagellates** (di-no-FLA-jel-lates). Each one is about the size of a pencil point, and it produces tiny sparks
