Seaside City Council revises homeless camping ordinance

SEASIDE — The City Council has formally adopted a revised homeless camping ordinance with amendments that extend the length-of-stay for homeless campers and RVs.

A third and final reading on Aug. 8 extended hours for overnight camping to six consecutive days before campers are required to move their tents and RVs.

The ordinance, which went into effect July 1, had required campers to enter the camping area at 8 p.m. and leave at 8 a.m., when the gates would be locked for the day.

The City Council revised the policy in late July. Campers may now stay 24 hours a day, six days a week, as long as they obey conditions of the ordinance and keep their sites clean.
