History Hood River County.

A valuable article contributed to the Oregonian by Frederick Holman, president of the Oregon Historical Society gives the origin and names of the various counties of the state. In referring to Hood River county it says:

Hood River county was created under an initiative petition, as provided by the constitution of Oregon, at the election held in June 1, 1908. The law thus creating it went into effect June 23, 1908. Its name is derived from Hood River, which rises at Mount Hood and runs through the country into the Columbia River. Mount Hood was discovered October 26, 1792, by Lieutenant W. R. Broughton, R. N., who was Vancouver's chief lieutenant and second in command of Vancouver expedition. He was the first to ascend the Columbia River, above the Tongue Point. He named the mountain for Lord Hood, an English nobleman, for whom is also named Hood's canal, an arm of Puget Sound.
