CUCUMBERS AS ORCHARD FILLERS

In another column we publish an ad for the Hood River Vinegar Company asking ranchers who may be interested in raising cucumbers to enquire at their office. Ranchers who have young trees or have the ground ready for planting can learn something of interest if they will investigate this as the vinegar company is experimenting with a plan that will provide orchard beginners with a crop the first year. It is expected to handle the cucumber business in connection with the vinegar plant and if it works out cucumbers are liable to prove the most valuable crop that can be raised as a filler in the valley.

Later Mr. Hill will organize a farmers' union at Hood River which will work in cooperation with other organizations here.

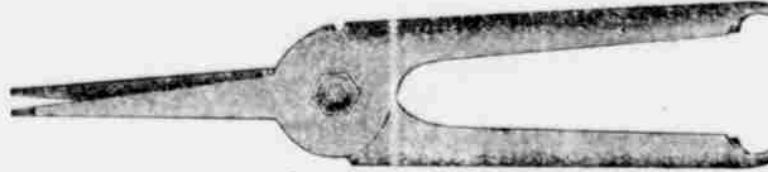
